

Choking the Bread

Eternally Speaking Now

As is our custom once a month, our church celebrated the Lord's Supper (communion) in April. Near the end of communion, a loud disturbance occurred behind me. Everyone turned to see what was happening, and Robin asked from the pulpit if one of the women was okay. The **bread** had apparently 'gone down the wrong pipe,' and she was uncomfortably coughing.

She tried to indicate she was okay, but she quickly got worse.

I rushed over to her side and laid my hand on her, gently calling on the name of Jesus. Everything seemed to go in slow motion: as my mouth said Jesus' name over and over, my mind cried out simultaneously within me, thinking, "Oh, Lord God! Certainly she won't choke on Your bread!"

As Robin prepared to do the Hymlich, the sweet woman's throat cleared, and she said she was okay. By then many of us were in quiet tears, greatly disturbed by the incident yet extremely relieved by its outcome.

> As I sat there holding the woman's hand, the Holy Spirit told me He had something to speak through this. I committed it to prayer and waited to hear from Him.

> > It didn't take long for His message to be revealed.

That afternoon, the Lord reminded me of the **Scripture** I'd read that very morning in my One Year **Bible**: the Parable of the Sower. The word **Choke** only appears in the Bible a few times, and every time it appears, it's found in this section of Scripture:

Jesus said,

"Listen! Behold, a sower went out to sow. And it happened, as he sowed, that some seed fell by the wayside; and the birds of the air came and devoured it. Some fell on stony ground, where it did not have much earth; and immediately it sprang up because it had no depth of earth. But when the sun was up it was scorched, and because it had no root it withered away. <u>And some seed fell among thorns;</u> <u>and the thorns grew up and choked it,</u> and it vielded no crop.

But other seed fell on good ground and yielded a crop that sprang up, increased and produced: some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some a hundred." And He said to them, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear!" (Mark 4:3-9)

What is Jesus talking about? What are these seeds and thorns? Thankfully, God's **Word** interprets His **Word**. He explains it clearly in the verses that follow. (Since this parable is in Matthew, Mark and Luke, I'm including the explanations from all three, providing the full picture I sense the Lord wants us to see.)

<u>Matthew 13:22</u> Now he who received seed among the thorns is he who hears the word, and the cares of this world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and he becomes unfruitful.

<u>Mark 4:18</u> Now these are the ones sown among thorns; they are the ones who hear the **word**, and the cares of this world, the deceitfulness of riches, and the desires for other things entering in choke the **word**, and it becomes **unfruitful**. <u>Luke 8:14</u> Now the ones that fell among thorns are those who, when they have heard, go out and are choked with cares, riches, and pleasures of life, and bring **no fruit to maturity.**

Get the picture?

I believe the Lord chose this dear, honorable woman of God at our church-the one who almost choked on the communion **bread**, to serve as a picture-to provide a warning, to any with ears to hear:

Don't choke the Bread of Life!

Don't let the cares, riches, and pleasures of life take a higher place than **Jesus Himself.** Amen.

CHALLENGE:

Check out what happened one week after the incident occurred with the woman and the communion **bread**:

Our church hosted an end-of-semester **dinne**r for the families of the children who come to our weekly after-school Good News Time. During the program, Robin was moved to give an **invitation** to any who would receive **Christ** as their Savior. Eight parents raised their hands! Most of them haven't darkened the doors of a church for decades.

The following weekend, on **Resurrection** Sunday, nine visitors-- more parents of Good News kids-- surrendered their lives to the Lord. Then eleven people got **baptized**! One elder said it was the best Resurrection service he'd ever experienced.

We had no idea the Lord would **pour out His Holy Spirit** in such a beautiful, powerful way. And He'd spoken ahead of time-- He'd vividly provided us with a word of preparation and warning beforehand: Pay attention! Listen! Be vigilant!

Do all you can to keep the thorns from choking the seeds of God's Word, planted in the hearts of these precious people, these new children of God.

But it goes farther...

I believe this wake-up call isn't limited to our little church and small rural town. Could it be a timely word for each of us individually? Could it be a word of warning for all of God's people across the land?

It's a terrible thing to be **unfruitful** for God! It's like holding the **key** to something amazing, yet not entering in. It's like having a **ticket** to something incredible, yet not participating. It's like being **invited** to the party of the year, yet not attending. It's surviving, not thriving.

Is there anyone in your realm of influence who may be in danger of the thorns of life-- riches, cares, pleasures, distractions-- choking the seed of God's **Word** in their lives? If so, they remain **unfruitful.**

Will you consider rushing over to them, gently placing your hand on their shoulder, interceding on their behalf in the name of Jesus, and preparing to do a 'spiritual Hymlich' if necessary?

It may be a matter of **life** and **death**, and you may be the very one God has chosen to help them **understand**. Read, study, listen to, and learn God's Word. If we **hear** the Bible and **understand** it, then the thorns won't choke the seed!

> *"But he who received seed on the good ground is he who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and produces: some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty." Matthew 13:23*
