St. Ignatius' Vision at the Cardoner River

This vision occurred in 1522, not long after Ignatius' conversion, as he was praying on the bank of the Cardoner River near the village of Manresa, Spain. While praying he remembers that the "eyes of his understanding were opened" and he began to see many things deeply.

This vision led him to know all things in the world as gifts from God. He realized in a new way that holiness did not happen through his own strength, and he surrendered to God's grace. The Ignatian tradition regards the Cardoner vision as a turning point in Ignatius' life and ministry.

He began to think of himself not as a solitary pilgrim, but as a person of the church to be of service to people. He also began to see Christ in a new way as laboring in the world to bring it back to God, and he began to see himself laboring alongside the risen Christ to make this happen. Perhaps we can let that vision rest in our hearts and call us to experience God calling us to service.


