My name is Cathy Ornelia, and I am an Akimel O'odham (Pima) woman and member of the Gila River Indian Community in Arizona. I am registered as an Authentic Certified Native American Artist through the U.S. Department of Indian Arts and Craft Board, and the owner of My Native Corner located in Escondido California.

"I have been sharing my Art with others since 1987. Sharing my Art and experiences has helped many people connect to Native American Culture, educating them on past and present life on a vibrant Southwest Indian reservation.

"Through my art, I will walk you through the Gila River Indian Community as I've known it as a child and now as an adult. 
