"First Class Easter"

I knew my cousin, Mark, was going to die. He had a very aggressive cancer that spread through his strong, middle-aged body, like a blight consuming a verdant forest. It was Lent about 15 years ago. Even though it was a very busy time, I drove the six hundred miles to see him again before he was gone. I needed to ask for his blessing. So, we prayed with and for each other, one last time.

My cousin, Mark, was more than family to me. Mark had been my pastor and my spiritual guide. I looked up to him in so many ways. Mark was fearless, fashionable, funny and faithful. Spending time with Mark had always been like traveling first class. Now, even with the cancer, Mark still had a playful twinkle in his eye. He knew full well that he would soon die. Mark did not surrender his hope and joy, because he trusted the resurrection that Christ was preparing for him.

I came home, and Lent wore on. I would get family updates as his end was getting closer. Mark spent his Holy Week in the hospital. I remember praying by myself for Mark, early on Easter morning, while it was still dark. Suddenly I had the strong intuition that Mark must already be dead. But here's the surprising thing, it did not make me sad. This thought that had come to me while praying: If Mark could get his way, there is no way he would settle for an Easter on earth, when he could have a first-class Easter in heaven.

Later that Easter Sunday, when we were gathered with family to enjoy a feast at my sister's house, we got the word that I had already anticipated in my prayers. Mark had died late on Saturday night. The thought of Mark attending the Easter feast in the Lord's house gave me the peace to celebrate with him the hope that we shared.

That was many years ago. Since then, many more loved ones have died. I think of them too at Easter. I also think of the first-class Easter that is yet to come for me. It can put a twinkle in my eye.



If you have a child in your life in Kindergarten-10th grade, we would love to see them July 14th-19th here at All Saints for Arts Camp 2025!



And forgive us our debts,


as we also have forgiven our debtors.

Senior Transportation Weekday Volunteers


