# All Saints Delegate to the National Youth Leadership Summit

For three days in November, high school youth from around the country gathered at Carol Joy Holling Camp in Ashland, Nebraska for the annual ELCA Youth Leadership Summit. Youth identified for their leadership skills and

potential were chosen to represent each synod of the ELCA (Evangelical Lutheran Church in America) at this annual gathering, where they received training in Peer Ministry Leadership as well as opportunities for worship, fellowship, affirmation and networking. Sydney Williams, a high school junior and member of All Saints, was excited to represent the Grand Canyon Synod at this event.

When Pastor Kristin Rice was asked by Pastor Jacqui Pagel, Assistant to the Bishop for Candidacy and Faith Formation, to identify a few youth who might be good candidates for this event, several All Saints students came to mind. It was easy for those who knew her to see why Sydney would be among them. A student at Mountain Ridge High School with special interests in media production, and an accomplished gymnast, Sydney has also been an active leader at All Saints, assisting with Vacation Bible School, serving as a counselor at Lutheran Campformation, helping with Sunday School and our Children's Music Ministry, and participating as one of the founding members of All Saints' newly forming youth praise band. She jumped at the opportunity to apply for a spot at the National Youth Leadership Summit, despite not quite

knowing what to expect.

"I didn't really know what I was getting into, so I just decided to go with the flow," Sydney said. It didn't take long before Sydney discovered the Summit to be a place of welcome, emotional safety and deep community. "It surprised me how open and vulnerable and inviting people were," Sydney reflected. "You could be yourself."



Whether providing an education for their young children, adult day care and support or nourishing food for a healthy diet, we are so grateful for your unwavering generosity to Desert Mission.



On behalf of the West Valley Community Food Pantry we would like to thank the Social Ministries Team, and the congregation of All Saints Lutheran Church for your very generous Thanksgiving donations. A special thank you to Sarah Manzanares for coordinating the donations. The 96 Thanksgiving food bags, the 78 gift cards, the 200 pounds of sugar, the 24 cans of corn, the 300 re-useable bags and the two Thrivent grants totaling \$500 made it possible for us to provide 177 families with a complete Thanksgiving meal and serve those in need. As grocery prices and needs rise, we depend even more from our sister congregations.

Additionally, we want to thank you for your very generous donation of \$1,650 in October to help fill additional Thanksgiving Food Boxes and others in need.

Again in 2021, we continued to get many new clients each day due to the Covid 19 Pandemic and the economy. During 2021, we served 24,404 clients during our normal working hours which shows the constant need for service. Sydney appreciated the atmosphere of welcome as well as the practical training about how to communicate care and inclusion to others, particularly when they may be having a hard time. Training included lessons on active listening—"how to listen and how to show people that you're listening," as Sydney described it, with an emphasis on body language. There were also opportunities to reflect together on the mental and emotional challenges teens commonly face and how to show love to people in these circumstances. Sydney was particularly thankful for the adult ministry leaders who shared their wisdom throughout the summit and formed a panel one day so that participants could ask them questions. She was gratified that even these adults were willing to open up about some of their own struggles, and appreciated their perspective on topics such as the importance of rest.

One notion shared by an adult leader really stuck with Sydney: the idea that life is a "blank canvas that God sits with you and helps you paint." Sydney was really drawn to the idea of God as one who comes alongside us, and whose care and compassion can be made real when we come alongside one another. It was a concept made real by Sydney's experience at the summit, and reinforced in the training she received. "God was there. You could feel this overwhelming goodness," she observed. "We had a lot of fun while also learning and changing. You wouldn't expect a whole lot of teenagers to be this way," Sydney remarked. Noting the common stereotypes of teens as "snarky" and inclined toward apathy, Sydney said, "Everyone was the complete opposite."

Youth who attended the Leadership Summit were challenged to take home what they learned so they could share and apply these skills in their relationships with others; Sydney has found that she has already opportunity to put her newly acquired wisdom into practice in her own peer relationships. In addition, she finds ongoing support, camaraderie and encouragement in the relationships she formed during her time in Nebraska. This year's participants have formed a "giant group chat"



where they continue to check in with each other and share their day—to-day experiences with one another via social media. In just a few days together, lasting friendships were formed. Sydney would heartily recommend the Youth Leadership Summit to other eligible youth, with gratitude for the financial support from the All Saints Youth Scholarship fund that helped make this experience possible. "It's a really important opportunity for people to understand and connect with others and to feel God's love."

Thank you, Sydney for representing us well; thank you, All Saints for your support of our youth ministry; and thank you God for the gifts you have poured into youth like Sydney, who are not only the leaders of tomorrow, but are blessing their churches and communities as leaders today.


