Preferred Qualifications:

- Experience creating, preparing and facilitating events and activities with seniors in mind
- Strong organizational skills
- Understanding of the aging process
- Experience managing a budget

Facility Manager

This is a CONTRACT-part time shared position (approx. 10-16 hours/week).

The Facility Manager is someone who would be excited about serving in a Christian organization. Some of the Facility Manager duties include:

- Open/Close rooms for Weekly Night time/Saturday-Sunday Mornings meetings/events
- Room Set Ups for meetings/events (i.e. table/chairs that may need to be set-up or rearranged)



3rd Annual Build a Thanksgiving Meal Food Bags

It's that time of year where the Social Ministry Team are promoting **Fill the Bag! Thanksgiving Meals** for those with food insecurities. All Saints has partnered again this year with the West Valley Community Food Pantry to provide Thanksgiving meals. Last year, All Saints generously donated 123 bags and 109 gift cards. Our goal this year is 150 bags with grocery gift cards to purchase a turkey.



Each reusable bag comes with a list to fill your bag with the ingredients to cook a traditional Thanksgiving meal for a family with canned and dried foods which typically cost around \$40.00. Every bag in addition receives a \$20.00 grocery gift card to purchase a turkey and a handwritten Thanksgiving card written by you. Thrivent Financial has donated our reusable bags this year again. Can't fill a bag yourself? Consider partnering with another church member or group of people to do one together.

The West Valley Community Food Pantry is located on the campus of St. John's Lutheran Church at 51st Ave and Myrtle and is an emergency food pantry. In 2023, WVCFP helped feed 29,794 people. During a given month they feed close to 2,700 people including children, adults, and the homeless.

Faithfully Engaged in the Election Process

Bishop's Letter: October 2024

"But let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream." - Amos 5:24

As early voting begins in Arizona, and with early voting also beginning soon in Utah and Nevada, I want to reflect on the sacred responsibility we hold as citizens and people of faith. Our participation in the democratic process is not only a privilege but a duty - one that reflects our commitment to justice, peace, and the flourishing of all people.

Throughout this election year, we have spoken about the importance of staying engaged in fair elections. This engagement is a direct expression of our faith, rooted in the understanding that each person is a beloved child of God, deserving of dignity and respect. Our call as followers of Christ is to seek the common good, ensuring that our elections are conducted with integrity, fairness, and transparency.

In a time when division can feel overwhelming, we are reminded of our biblical call to love our neighbor as ourselves. Voting provides us with an opportunity to act on that love, making choices that uphold the values of justice, equity, and compassion in our communities.

As early voting begins, I encourage you to take time for prayerful reflection on the issues that are most important to you. Consider how your vote can contribute to shaping a future focused on hope and the well-being of all people. I also invite you to gather with others in your congregation and community to discuss the propositions and candidates. Together, we can engage thoughtfully and meaningfully with the initiatives on the ballot.

The Office of the Bishop staff has devoted particular attention to sharing resources in this election season. If you are living in Arizona, <u>LAMA created a guide to the 2024 Arizona Ballot Measures</u>. We've also shared <u>important voting dates in Arizona</u>, <u>Nevada</u>, and <u>Utah in our calendar</u>.

I also want to draw your attention to the <u>Church and Society resource page</u> on the Grand Canyon Synod website. This page is filled with valuable resources that explore important election issues, offer guidance on Christian nationalism, and provide tools for ensuring the safety and well-being of our congregations during these complex times. I encourage you to visit this page and share it with others in your community as we navigate this election season with faith and discernment.

I am grateful for the participation on our recent Conversation About Congregational Safety Zoom call. Dozens of congregational leaders joined us to address concerns about political violence and shared resources from both the FBI and the ELCA on Christian nationalism. We received excellent feedback from this conversation and gained even more resources to support our ongoing efforts to keep our communities safe. These discussions are vital as we continue to work toward creating secure spaces for all, especially during such a polarized time.

We believe that God listens to and answer our prayers. So with bold confidence we pray for our neighbors, our leaders, and for the systems that guide our nation. Let us pray:

Gracious God, guide us as we take part in this election process. Grant us wisdom, humility, and a heart for justice. May your spirit of peace fill our communities as we seek to serve you and one another. In your holy name, we pray. Amen.
