## Living Saints: Suzanne Carlisle

I grew up attending the local Lutheran church in my Upper Peninsula of Michigan hometown and enjoyed all the Sunday School, Confirmation, VBS, and youth group experiences that were available to me.

In 2009 I attended a very fun Trunk-or-Treat event here at All Saints with my son, Duncan, then 4-years-old. The following spring and summer I signed Duncan up to attend VBS and volunteered to be a Crew Chief in his class, because that's what helicopter parents do. We continued this tradition through 2017, when Duncan became a Crew Chief too.





In fall of 2010, I became an official member of the church, and joined the MOPS group. This also began my Busy Bag adventures (featuring the everpopular Busy Bag Buffalo) in early 2012 and is something I still enjoy doing to this day.

In fall of 2013 I was recruited as Sunday School Shepherd for the third grade class and continued to shepherd this class through all of Duncan's Sunday School and Confirmation years, until he was confirmed in our pandemic-Zoom ceremony in May of 2020.

In 2014 I also decided it would be interesting to take over the vacant church Librarian position and soon realized that this job is more involved than I originally thought, as book donations increase and the bookcases fill up. I did feel some relief when the church staff decided to downsize the library in 2022, bringing an end to my Librarian career.

And lastly, for many years I have helped out at the Receptionist desk a couple of times a month. Eventually, this expanded to every Tuesday morning.


This month's selection: *Lessons in Chemistry* by Bonnie Garmus

The real challenges we face in our work to cultivate healthy community and human flourishing are not the ones that typically catch our attention and focus our efforts. The problems are more than the overt injustices; they exist as unidentified, and thus, intractable, presumptions that animate our efforts towards the good. Dietrich Bonhoeffer offers an example of this challenge.

He offers a sincere and lasting Christian response to the crisis in Germany that was contrast to the near wholesale acquiescence that was common among the general protestant German population. Yet, he also struggled with a common presumption, the problem of the human, i.e. an ideal to which we aspire without question. In this lecture we will take a brief look at this problem by looking at Bonhoeffer's effort, with the help of the Black Radical Tradition as exemplified by Cedric Robinson.
