You Are Welcome Here!

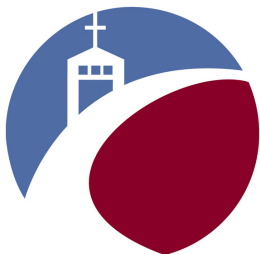
By God's grace, we have all been welcomed into God's family.
