Sanctuary and Zoom Worship September 12th, 10 AM

Over the past 18 months, so much has changed and so much has remained the same. On September 12, we will begin worshipping again in our sanctuary after 10 months of being away. We will find the same slate floors, comfy chairs, beautiful banners and, of course, familiar faces. However, we will find that some things have changed, as well. There have been several special modifications made to accommodate our new 4-camera system. Three cameras have been wall mounted and one camera is on a large rolling tripod. Seating will be different now because of the camera placement. Think of this as an opportunity to sit next to someone new! The area in the rear of the sanctuary that houses the sound system has also been expanded to allow space for the camera computer system, the video technician, as well as, our sound technician.

Our Sunday service is now what is being referred to as "hybrid worship" meaning we will continue to live stream our worship, as well as, being in-person. Over the past year, we have realized that many people cannot attend in-person worship because of health concerns, vacations, or living a distance away. Live streaming allows them to remain a vital part of our church family. Throughout the summer, about half of the attendees have been participating via Zoom. Others, however, are watching the services on YouTube or Facebook at their convenience. As a result of the pandemic, our church will no longer be defined geographically, by a building or even by specific worship times.

The new camera cart and tech station were constructed by Kevin Ingalls in memory of Earl Chamberlain. The narthex has been beautifully updated, also by Kevin, in memory of Billy Kress, and Bill and Carolyn Ogren. Dedications of these renovations will be held later this fall.

With the onset of the Delta variant, masks will continue to be required for worship services. In addition, seating will be arranged with social distancing in mind. As we transition back into in-person worship, many will remain hesitant to shake hands, hug or touch physically, and we ask for all to be respectful of each individual's wishes.




Adult Enrichment
