As part of our worship service on May 21, we will have an opportunity to offer God our personal commitment of our time, our abilities, and our financial resources for the work of the church in our community and the world as a whole.

More than just a monetary commitment, what we offer to God on that day is ourselves as stewards and servants in the kingdom of God. On that day, whatever we

bring will be consecrated (made holy) for God's purposes.

This year, in preparation for this important day, we have chosen to focus on the words of the Apostle Paul in I Corinthians 3: 6-7

"So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow."

This Bible verse is one of many that references agriculture and farming, because the imagery is so relatable. We know what it's like to plant seeds, tend to young shoots, pluck out the weeds, and try to deter the bugs and wildlife that would destroy the maturing plant. This is all done in the hopes of reaping a bountiful harvest or enjoying the fragrance and beauty of blooms and blossoms.

We know that the plant doesn't mature in an instant; it takes time and care. We who plant, water, weed, and protect, are partners with God - the only One who truly makes the plant grow.

#### **Summer Worship Weather Guidelines**

Outdoor Worship will not be conducted if:

- Outdoor temperature is under 55 degrees
- Heat Advisory issued by the National Weather Service
- Precipitation or the threat of precipitation
- Wind interference with the sound system or camera system
- Other weather-related conditions or impending weather changes that would interfere with conducting a full worshipful service.

The decision for worship to be ONLY available on Zoom will be made by the participating worship leadership one hour prior to the service. Please check our website for updated information.

# **Kitchen and Bathroom Construction Update**

Heaters and air conditioning units are up and operational. We have installed the tank-less hot water heater, and the electrician should be finished with new electrical service panel upgrades by the time this article goes to print. The new washer and dryer will soon be delivered, nearly completing the utility room portion of this renovation. The kitchen cabinets are expected to arrive sometime toward the end of June.

We anticipate the installation to begin following the July fourth holiday. Soon, we will be patching and painting the kitchen walls. We hope to have this completed prior to cabinet install. I am hoping that much of the painting can be done with volunteer labor, and I will be busy seeking that help!


### Flower Sign-up
