There are different aspects of stewardship: using our time, talents, and resources to help support the work of our church, as well as using these God-given gifts to care for the planet that has been entrusted to us.

The Stewardship of Life Institute provides this guidance, "To be a steward of one's neighbor implies getting to know others, to seek understanding and common ground. It means praying for the welfare of those one does not know and bridging the gap by finding ways to enter into relationship and learn from each other. It means seeing the image of God and the face of Christ in everyone, and it means stepping way out of our secure personal space and cultural

comfort zones. These are hard teachings, ones that convict us and drive us to our knees at the foot of the cross. Thankfully, the discipleship journey is one of lifelong learning and constant revision. After all, it is only by the grace and mercy of the Son of God that we are able to even begin to faithfully steward this amazing gift of relationship and love of neighbor."

Many of us provide our time and talents for organizations that serve our neighbors: the Red Cross, volunteering with literacy agencies, making quilts and hats for children in foster care, just to name a few. One local organization that embodies the aims of stewardship is Street Soldiers. Their goal is

Leadership Retreat



On November 3rd and 4th, the church's staff and consistory members retreated to Christ the King Spiritual Center in Greenwich, NY for their annual leadership retreat. This year's retreat focused on CRCC's past and present. It was an important time to recognize what we had lost in Rev. Cornwell's passing, as well as the current challenges, successes, and ways we've seen God show up in the present time. Tears, laughs, and important conversations were all shared.

There will not be a search committee formed in the immediate future for a new pastor. This next year will be spent processing our grief and discerning the needs of the congregation. The biggest mistake a church can make is rushing into finding a new pastor. Even when a beloved minister retires, there needs to be a significant time of mourning and discernment. Reverend Cornwell's tenure was substantial and his passing devastating. It will take time for us to heal and to be in the appropriate place to begin looking for a new minister.



In the meantime, we continue to have the support of our Classis Care Team, of our



interim Pastor Bob Hoffman, and a strong leadership team in the consistory and staff. We were fortunate to have many conversations with Bruce before he passed. We will continue to spread the love and message of Jesus Christ Sunday mornings in the pulpit and throughout the week in our small groups.

If you ever have a question or concern, PLEASE speak to Pastor Bob, a member of Consistory, or a staff member. We WELCOME open communication and intend to be as transparent as possible.

The Peace Corps was the recipient of a donation this past August. Below is a brief overview obtained from the Peace Corps website. If you would like more information highlighting "the power of human connection" search: Peacecorps.gov.

On October 14, 1960, the future President of the US, John F. Kennedy, issued a challenge to 10,000 students at the University of Michigan: How many of them would be willing to serve their country and the cause of peace by living and working in the developing world?

Since then, over 240,000 Americans have responded to that challenge.

The Peace Corps celebrated its 60th Anniversary in 2021. It was initially established by President John F. Kennedy on March 1, 1961, and formally authorized by the Congress on September 22, 1961, with the passage of the Peace Corps Act. In 1961, volunteers began serving in 5 countries. Within 6 years, programs were in 55 countries with over 14,500 volunteers. Today, opportunities continue to be offered in over 60 countries. Volunteers live and work side by side with community members:

- Building relationships
- Exchanging cultures and knowledge
- Helping transform lives

Volunteers work within six established sectors - agriculture, community economic development, education, environment, health, and youth development.

In 1983, Peace Corps partnered with the President's programs including:

- Small Project Assistance
- Stomping Out Malaria in Africa (the Malaria Initiative collaborating in 18 countries)
- Global Food Security (the Feed the Future program)
- Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (with the targeted goal for an AIDS-free generation)
