There's an easy way to properly recycle your refundable cans and bottles. No counting, no rinsing, and no waiting in long lines to make your return! And you'll be raising money for our Church so we can continue to spread God's word and do good works.

There are green plastic CLYNK bags in the church entryway that can be brought home and filled with your refundable cans and bottles. Every bag has a white sticker with a barcode. When your bag is about 2/3 full, tie it up and bring it to any Hannaford CLYNK machine (usually found in the store's entryway). Use the scanner on the wall by the machine to zap the bar code. Then place the bag in the designated door. Done! You can also bring your bottles and cans to church, and leave them in the designated container in the narthex.





The Church earns approximately \$500 per year from CLYNK. Without recycling, plastic bottles take up to 450 years to decompose, aluminum cans take 80-200 years to decompose, and glass bottles take up to a million years or never decompose at all.
