### Ellen and Bill Buono Sign Off

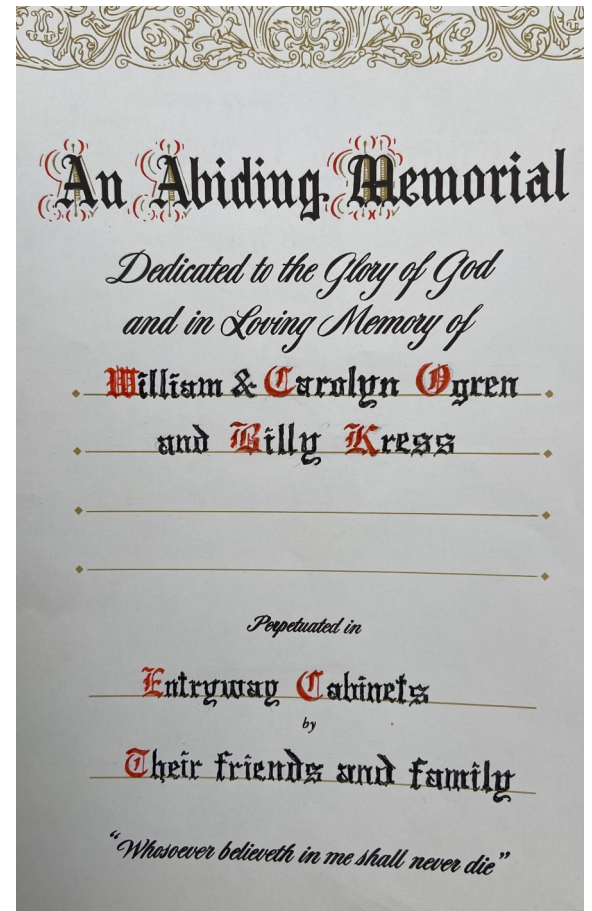

## Making the most of God's treasures to you...



If you are age 70½ or older by the end of 2021, have traditional IRAs with required minimum distributions, and especially if you are unable to itemize your deductions, consider making 2020 charitable donations via qualified charitable distributions from your IRAs. These distributions are made directly to charities from your IRAs, and the amount of the contribution is neither included in your gross income nor deductible on Schedule A, Form 1040. However, you are still entitled to claim the entire standard deduction. This also reduces your adjusted gross income, which may reduce the taxability of your social security benefits, depending on your tax bracket.

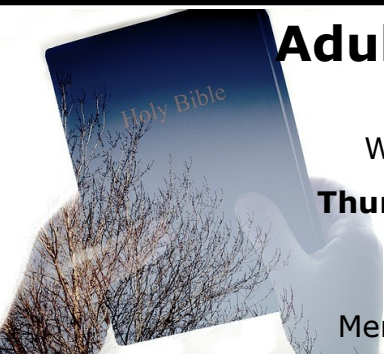
