THE GOSPEL LESSON Luke 19:28-40

Passion Sunday Crosses

The palm crosses that were distributed in our Paschal Parcels were handmade by families in several villages in East Africa, to supplement meager incomes. Sales help support community projects such as agricultural and vocational training, schools, water systems, and emergency relief.





Easter Ribbons of Hope

Again this year we will adorn our Easter Cross with Ribbons of Hope.

On these ribbons we ask you to write or draw your hope for Easter 2022 - hope for yourself, family, community, world, or whatever is on your heart during these difficult days.

The ribbons will be attached to the Lenten cross which has been made from the trunks of Christmas trees. This symbolically follows Christ's life from His birth through His resurrection.

We ask for your ribbons to be returned today and placed in the basket on the back table or mailed to the church office this week. You do not have to sign your name to the ribbon.

On Easter morning, we will celebrate the glory of our Risen Lord with our Easter hopes.



April 15 7 PM

Tenebrae, or "Service of Shadows," is one of the oldest traditions in the Christian church for the commemoration of the passion and death of Christ. Through scripture readings and hymns the story of Christ's betrayal, trial, and crucifixion is told. As the Passion story unfolds, candles are removed symbolizing the fleeing of the disciples. The darkness deepens, until only the Christ Candle remains.

This light is removed from the sanctuary representing Christ's crucifixion and death. The Light of our Church returns in glory Easter morning.

Due to the somber intensity of this service, child care is provided for children 2nd grade and younger.

This service will also be live-streamed on Zoom.
