PRELUDE "Dust and Ashes"

COMMUNITY GATHERS

THE TRADITION OF ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. The early Christians held that before people could experience new life at Easter, they had to let their faults and bad habits die away or more symbolically, "turn to ash". Ashes were scattered over the heads of those who had sinned and who were seeking forgiveness. Ash continues to be used by many churches to remind people to repent; that is, to be sorry for their mistakes, to change their way of thinking and to look for ways to be better and stronger. During the service, a cross is marked in ash on the forehead of each member of the congregation. The ash is a reminder that when we die, our bodies then decay and turn to ash. The cross reminds us that the Spirit exists forever.

There are forty days of Lent (not counting Sundays), from Ash Wednesday until Easter morning. The number forty recalls the forty hours that Jesus was in the tomb between Good Friday and Easter morning. We are reminded as well of the forty days that Jesus fasted during his temptation in the wilderness. The early church believed that the number forty, when applied to time - forty hours, forty days, forty years - is the necessary period for cleansing or testing and strengthening which allows the "fullness of wisdom to become reality."

But we also remember that we are are divine and beloved beings, and there is magnificence in us even in the pain and grief.

We hold on to our brilliance in the darkness knowing it will be our strength that will carry us through.

Thank you Jesus, that in your divinity, you have shown us the divine image within us.

We are aware of the brokenness that every person carries, we know that grief and sorrow are present within each person.

In this community we want to be witnesses to each other's stories, all the good and the brokenness.

May we know that there is a space where we can find healing, rest, and companionship.

We pray for each person carrying a little more than they feel they can manage; may they find rest here. Amen.

SCRIPTURE LESSON Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

"Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven. "So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.
