"There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are


different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work" (1 Corinthians 12:4-6).




During the summer months, outdoor services are welcomed by many in our church family.

If this occurs, the worship leaders will conduct worship on Zoom only, without in-person worshippers.


