Easter Ribbons of Hope

Again this year we will adorn our Easter Cross with Ribbons of Hope.

On these ribbons we ask you to write or draw your hope for Easter 2024 – hope for yourself, family, community, world, or whatever is on your heart during these difficult days. The ribbons will be attached to the Lenten cross which has been made from the trunks of Christmas trees. This symbolically follows Christ's life from His birth through His resurrection.

On Easter morning, we will celebrate the glory of our Risen Lord with our Easter hopes.

Monday April 15, 6:30 p.m. at the First Church in Albany, 110 N. Pearl Street, Albany and Tuesday April 16, 7:00 p.m. at the First Reformed Church in Schenectady, 8 North Church Street

You are invited to join Churches for Middle East Peace (CMEP) in a conversation about peacebuilding and advocacy related to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. Speakers include the Rev. Dr. Mae Cannon, executive director of Churches for Middle East Peace, and Tamar Haddad, the Coordinator at Churches for Middle East Peace's women empowerment program: And Still We Rise (ASWR). Dr. Cannon is the author of several publications about the conflict including A Land Full of God: Christian Perspectives toward the Holy Land (Cascade, 2017). Tamar Haddad is based in Jerusalem and previously served as the Project Manager for Gender Justice at the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL). This year presentations will give particular attention to the events that have unfolded in the Holy Land since October 7, 2023.

Formed in 1984, Churches for Middle East Peace (cmep.org) is a coalition of national church denominations and organizations working to encourage U.S. policies that actively promote just, lasting and comprehensive resolutions to conflicts in the Middle East.
