1 Corinthians 12:4-6.



We have the opportunity to investigate the gifts that have been provided to us from God by completing the gift inventory sent to members of our CRCC family in February. This project allows us to prayerfully consider the gifts that we have been given, as well as those not yet realized that may need some exploration. We can then explore how our God given gifts can strengthen the work carried out at CRCC.

As we approach Consecration Sunday on May 19th, we think about how God wants us to use the gifts given to us, we can reflect on everything that has been provided to us from God, and ponder how we might give a share of these gifts back to God.




