Look through your book shelf and set aside your used soft-cover or hard-cover books to donate to our sale.


We are happy to accept most types of books. Please **no textbooks**, nor anything with content inappropriate for sale at church.

On the afternoon of October 12, 1990, my twin brother, Thomas, entered the Three Rivers, Connecticut, public library, retreated to one of the rear study carrels, and prayed to God the sacrifice he was about to commit would be deemed acceptable . . ."

So begins the acclaimed novel, *I Know This Much is True*, by Wally Lamb, The Book Group's selection for this month.

Thomas and Dominick are identical twins, one born on December 31st and the other born on January 1st, straddling the two halves of the 20th century. Their unmarried mother, Connie, raised by her strict Italian father, is a timid and ineffectual woman. The boys are never told who their biological father is, and both have a very contentious relationship

with Ray, their volatile and often brutal stepfather.

Thomas is a paranoid schizophrenic. Dominick has spent his life defending him from school yard bullies, his stepfather, and the impersonal and institutionalized mental health system. The story begins with Thomas's sacrifice, so gruesome and horrific that it is difficult to envision, but it is really Dominick's story of learning to face his own demons and forgive himself.
