Spotlight: Norm Jardine Honors Through Song and Service

In addition to helping organize the Class of 1965 reunion, **Norm Jardine '65** continues to share his voice and spirit at community events, keeping the legacy of Power alive through music, remembrance, and service.

This past September 11th, Norm sang the **National Anthem** at both the **Town of North Hempstead's morning remembrance ceremony** and the **Village of Williston Park's evening memorial service**. His heartfelt performances served as a moving tribute to those we lost, and a reminder of the unity and resilience that define both our nation and the Power brotherhood.

Norm's devotion extends well beyond the stage. He recently completed his **Memorial Day activities**, visiting **seven cemeteries** to honor the deceased members of his **American Legion post**, neighborhood friends, and family members of his Power classmates who have since moved away. He also visited the graves of two Power alumni: **Roy Koenig '65**, his classmate who was killed in Vietnam in **August 1968**, and **Pat Gallagher '62**, former student council president and captain of the track team, who after graduating from Providence College in 1966 became a Marine Lieutenant and was killed in Vietnam in **September 1967**. These solemn visits highlight Norm's deep respect for the sacrifices of his classmates and fellow alumni.

This past summer, on July 13, 2025, Norm performed the National Anthem to open a concert by the Nassau Pops Symphony Orchestra at Mineola Memorial Park. The Pops are led by Power Hall of Fame member Maestro Lou Panacciulli, whose musical style reflects the influence of the late Mr. Gene Morra, beloved band director at Power. Norm described the evening as both a privilege and a joy: "The

music of the Pops under Lou's baton is very influenced by Mr. Morra. It felt like bringing Power's spirit full circle."

Beyond the spotlight, Norm has also spent the summer working closely with **Monsignor Scanlan High School**, helping them **train staff to manage their finances more effectively**. His dedication to Scanlan strengthens the partnership between our alumni association and the school that now serves as a home for the Power legacy, including the growing **Memorabilia Room**.

For Norm, singing the National Anthem is more than performance — it is an act of pride and remembrance. He has sung for his American Legion on Memorial Day and the Fourth of July, and plans to do so again on Patriotic Day, 9/11, and Veterans Day. He has sung at Power reunions, and has been invited to perform for Monsignor Scanlan High School at their reunion. Norm is also awaiting word on an invitation to sing at New York State Assemblyman Edward Ra's annual Salute to Veterans, an event Ra hosts each year to honor service members.

Even when his schedule is packed, Norm finds time to share his gift. After the Nassau Pops concert, he left early to join a **Summer Sing in Garden City** — a true testament to his passion for music and his dedication to honoring through song and service.

FORMER PMAAA VICE PRESIDENT, MICHAEL KELLY, PASSES

Michael Kelly, who graduated from Power in 1955, passed away on August 17, 2025 at home. He was 88.

Michael was born and raised in the Inwood section of New York City to Irish immigrants on March 12, 1937, to the late Michael and Celia (Connolly) Kelly. He married his high school sweetheart and the love of his life, Mary Jane Ekins, on October 24, 1959 in New York City. They spent their years raising their family and traveling the world together. Michael was preceded in death by his wife who passed on May 3, 2011.


Michael was actively involved in his community, including interest in local science fairs. He was a longtime member and past Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus, Wappingers Council #1646, as well as past president of the Dutchess County Ancient Order of Hibernians. He was a founder and past Grand Marshall of the Dutchess County St. Patrick's Parade and involved in the New York City St. Patrick's Parade; they were both important to him and his deep connection to his Irish heritage. In his spare time, Michael was an avid New York Yankees fan. He was also a longtime volunteer and parishioner at St. Mary's Church in Wappingers Falls.

Michael joined the Power Memorial Academy Alumni Association in 2005 and eventually was elected Vice President of the Association. During his tenure on PMAAA Board, Mike was instrumental in expanding the Association. He was very proud of being a graduate of PMA and strove to continue the PMA values and traditions through the PMAAA scholarship program. Former PMAAA Board Member Joe Maffia, Passes

On Friday, August 15, we lost Joseph Maffia, who died at home in New York City at the age of 66. By any and all measures Joseph Maffia was an extraordinary human being, a greatly devoted and deeply adored husband, father, brother, grandfather, uncle and friend. A successful businessman, a wonderful and beloved teacher - socially engaged and politically active, a private man but a public figure who was blessed with a first class intellect and a rare wit and was always ready to lend a helping hand.

Joey was complex, surprising, and rich with contradictions - ebullient on the one hand, shy on the other; charming as well as serious; a devout Catholic known for his irreverent sense of humor; admired for his easy going manner but also for his gravity. He was a street corner kid as a young boy, a renowned graffiti artist, a charming rascal, city wise and New York quick, and he carried the street with him all his life even as he forged a distinguished career as an entrepreneur, business leader, neighborhood activist, political candidate and gifted teacher. Joey was generous, gentle and kind, a fine photographer, a former athlete and college track star, a lifelong lover of music and sports, a figure of surpassing dignity and grace.



His sudden and unexpected death came as a terrible shock - this man was always so alive! - He made us laugh so often - and his passing has unleashed a great wave of grief. Those of us who love Joe also love his wife MJ and will do what we can to keep her close and carry her through this heartbreaking time.

MJ is a successful businesswoman who added her financial and business acumen to his and sweetened her husband's very busy life by virtue of her consistent grace, her lively sense of pleasure, her gift for giving and receiving love, and her unfailing kindness.

Joe Maffia was a great man - truly great - and he will be truly and greatly missed. He leaves behind too many mourners to count, but you can't honor Joseph Maffia's memory without celebrating his wife
