The event will take place on November 12<sup>th</sup> and will start at 6 PM at the Immaculate Conception Center located at 7200 Douglaston Pkwy, Queens, NY 11362. The cost for admission is \$125 per person.

The Association will induct eleven new members and two Power Track Team groups into the association's Hall of Fame. 


#### Br. Peter Costa, CFC - Faculty

A Newark, New Jersey native who came to Power in 1974 and remained until its closing in 1984. Classes taught by Brother Costa included English, Religion, Reading & Creative Writing. Br. Costa was also a vigorous presence in the life of Power students as Dean of Students and Athletic Director. During his tenure as AD, he guided and nurtured numerous championship teams, encouraged the development of student athletes and their coaches, and introduced the hockey program. After Power closed, he went on to obtain his doctorate in Clinical Psychology while teaching in a variety of settings including Monsignor Farrell High School, the Arthur Kill Correctional Center and The College of Staten Island.

#### Anthony Grasso - Faculty

Started his teaching career at Power in 1970 serving as a biology teacher and ultimately Chairman of the Biology Department from 1979-84. Among his many coaching assignments was serving as Head Coach of the 1978 Frosh Basketball City Championship team as well as the JV Basketball Head Coach from 1980-1984. In addition to his strong influence on his students and players, he served as a key leader on the "Keep Power Open" fight up until the day the doors on Amsterdam Avenue were permanently closed. Tony went on to teach, coach and lead at Xaverian High School in Brooklyn (1984-1999) and St. John Neumann High School in Naples, Florida (1999-2010). Tony has been inducted into the Halls of Fame at Xaverian High School and St. John Neumann







#### Edward 'Jack' Kuhnert – Faculty ('61 – '71)

Mr. Kuhnert taught Math after graduating from Manhattan College. Mr. Kuhnert was elevated to the Varsity Coach in 1965 and coached numerous successful teams culminating with the 1970 undefeated (22-0) and nationally ranked #1 1970 team. Following that season, he moved closer to home and coached at Freehold HS where he won a NJ State Title in addition to 7 divisional crowns. The Freehold Holiday Tournament was renamed the "Jack Kuhnert Holiday Tournament" after his sudden passing in October 1997, after 27 years of service. The basketball court at the HS was also named in His honor.

Mr. Kuhnert was bestowed numerous awards for his excellence in Coaching and Teaching. Mr. Kuhnert is survived by his wife and a daughter.

#### Lou Santos - PMA '65

Three things come to mind when speaking of Lou Santos...teaching, coaching and community service. After graduating from Power, Lou received a BA in secondary education from St. John's University and an MA in Spanish from Iona College. After early stints at St. Raymond's, St. Michael's and St. Helena's, Lou settled down to teaching Spanish at Archbishop Molloy for 39 years. He showed an interest in coaching at age 16 and has coached every year since. In addition to coaching baseball and softball at the school's <u>he's</u> taught in, <u>he's</u> also coached at several area colleges, the CYO and Sandlot Athletic Alliance. While serving on the Boards of several colleges and youth organizations, he also engages in fundraising and donation efforts for organizations like Wounded Warriors and Ronald McDonald House, to name a few.






#### Major General (Ret) George Alexander, M.D. - PMA '70


After graduating from Power, George completed premedical studies at Columbia College of Columbia University and medical school at Howard University, followed by postgraduate medical specialty studies at various institutions around the country, while combining his medical training with military service to the country. He has 25 years' experience in military and operational medicine and is a widely recognized expert on medical effects of weapons of mass destruction. He was the highest-ranking physician in the Army National Guard, advising the US Army Surgeon General on all aspects of health and care of 350,000 ARNG soldiers and has served as Director for Public Health in the Office of Homeland Security as well as Chief of Special Populations Studies at the National Cancer Institute.

#### Robert Reeg - PMA '70

After graduating from Power and attending Iona College, Robert's admiration for emergency work performed by our city's Police, Fire and EMS services inspired him to apply to the FDNY and to join a local volunteer ambulance corps, eventually joining the NYC Emergency Medical Service where he served as a paramedic assigned to the Bellevue Hospital Center. Appointed to the FDNY in 1982, he served 21 years in Engine 44 on the Upper East Side of Manhattan. While operating at the WTC on September 11<sup>th</sup> Rob received life threatening injuries from the collapse of the South Tower. Although he recovered from his injuries, he was medically retired from the FDNY in 2003. Since then, he has served as an American Red Cross volunteer, responding to local and national emergencies and he volunteers at



various area veteran's organizations. He has raised and trained a therapy dog and visits special needs children and wounded warriors to provide comfort to those with injuries or disabilities.



#### Edwin Searcy - PMA '70

Edwin "Sky Lab" Searcy attended PMA from 1966 to 1970. He was an All American in basketball and went on to play at Duquesne and then St. John's University before being drafted in the 1974 NBA Draft. Edwin was a member of the Celtics NBA Championship Team in 1976. Edwin obtained a Masters from NYU and had a successful career in Real Estate and IT. Edwin is known to be a very competitive chess player and he won many matches at the NYC park on 141st Street and St. Nick Avenue.






#### Japeth (Jap) Trimble - PMA '70

After attending Our Lady Queen of Angels in East Harlem, Japeth attended PMA from 1966 to 1970. Japeth was one of the three All Americans on the 1970 undefeated, and #1 Nationally Ranked Team. Upon graduating he attended University of Maryland and played Basketball. Japeth is a Hearst Corporate Eagle Scout. Japeth was a Special Agent for the NSA and Authored their Affirmative Action Policy. He also worked for Amtrak and was a TV Advertising and Marketing Executive in addition to being a Director of Basketball Operations for Fila, USA. Japeth also created a TV campaign for Teens that was nominated for an Emmy Award. Japeth has one daughter, who he raised as a single parent, and he has two Grandsons. Japeth resides in Henderson, NV.

#### John Boyle – PMA '71

A stellar student and outstanding athlete and leader while at Power. Co-Captain of the Varsity Basketball team, Captain of the Varsity Baseball team and a major contributor to the success of all the teams for which he donned the Purple and Gold. He lettered in baseball and basketball and graduated *cum laude* with a bachelor's degree in mathematics from Hobart College. Served as a Telecommunications Officer for five years in the United States Air Force, followed by a successful 40 year career as a Systems Engineer for leading companies in the technology industry while obtaining numerous post graduate degrees. Committed to family and service in his retirement, John serves as a Eucharistic Minister as well as tutor to new immigrant children in his Raleigh, North Carolina community.





#### Gerard (Rod) Mullin – PMA '79

After attending grade school in Brooklyn, Rod attended PMA from 1975 to 1979. He played baseball and basketball all four years. Rod played basketball at Siena College from 1979 through graduation in 1983. Gerard had a distinguished career at the New York Power Authority as Director of Fuels for 33 years. Gerard passed away in 2019 after a brave battle with cancer. He is survived by his wife and three children. He also had three brothers and a sister.



#### Jesse Fong - PMA '81

A premier performer for the Power basketball teams. He helped lead his teams to City Championships during his Freshman (1978) and JV (1979) campaigns. Also played a critical role on the 1981 Varsity team that was the runner-up to the City Champs. After graduation, he continued to exhibit basketball prowess at Dowling College where he captained the team for three years scoring over 1,000 points in his college career. He joined federal law enforcement where he steadily rose up the ranks and earned many commendations culminating in his position as the Drug Enforcement Administration's Special Agent in Charge of the Washington Office where he managed over 450 employees responsible for thousands of narcotics operations. Jesse retired in 2020 after a 35 year career in federal law enforcement.



## **POWERFUL THOUGHTS 15**

Chris (fictitious name but real person) was one year behind me at PMA. We raced on the track team for two years. His specialty was the 440 yard dash. Mine were the 100 yard dash, long jump, high jump and 220 yard dash. I tried pole vaulting, javelin throwing, as well as throwing the shot put. Not very successful at the latter three, however.

Chris, who also wore one of the "elite eight" track warmup uniforms, was a speedster, along with three other PMA runners who clipped 12 seconds off the high school 4 x 440 mile relay at a dual meet against Xavier Military Academy in 1956.

After Chris graduated, he attended Fordham University and received a commission in the USAR. He went to work for Union Carbide, then met his service obligation at the Presidio of California in San Francisco. Then, serendipitously, we met again in 1964 at the Presidio. I was a brand new second lieutenant; he was a first lieutenant.

One of my many duties was as "prosecuting attorney" at summary courts-martials: forfeiture of 2/3 of one's pay and six month's confinement in prison. Chris was the current prosecutor and was assigned to train me as his replacement. (I prosecuted 114 cases with 110 convictions. Not bad for a non-lawyer!)

Another personal duty was as Post sports officer. I was player-coach on the flag football team, volleyball team, fastpitch softball team, soccer team and the basketball team. Chris joined us on the basketball team in 1964-1965. Headquarters Company, of which I was a Company Officer, won the Post championship and went to the Sixth Army competition outside of Las Vegas, Nevada. We came in third, having lost to the team that came in first.

Chris was to be separated from the Army in 1965. He came to see me at Headquarters Company shortly before his departure. He would return to Union Carbide and await the birth of his second child. I don't recall whether he had a young boy or girl already, but he and his wife were very excited about the second birth.

Months passed before I received a letter from Chris after he got home. I opened it and began reading of his and his wife's tragic plight. His first child died of some form of cancer and his wife miscarried their second child, probably as a consequence of the death,.

To this day I still cry when I recollect Chris's tragedy.

### MY VISIT TO WEST PARK, NY


