

The following information was taken from the 1972 Power Yearbook:

What an unbelievable year! The 1971-72 Power Panthers were supposed to be a year away. They surprised everyone by their fantastic performance. They won the Mount St. Michael's Christmas Tournament, the CHSAA Division I Sectional Championship and the City Championship. And they did it the hard way.

After winning their first nine games straight the Panthers were dealt a severe blow when it was discovered that their star center 6'10" Tom Weadock could not play for the rest of the season due to a bone infection. This made it possible for 6'8" sophomore Robert Misevicius to come into his own. Along with Misevicius, Herb Rhaburn, Glenn Kolonics, Gene Saunders, Rodney Evans, Steve Richardson and sparkplug Charlie Ryan put it all together.

Robert Misevicius led the team in scoring with 16.4 points per game and rebounding with 10.5 rebounds per game. Glenn Kolonics was second high scorer with an average of 12.1 points per game and consistent Herb Rhaburn was third with an 11.7 point average. He was also second in rebounding with an average of 9 rebounds per game. Charlie Ryan led the team in assists with 193. He set a Power record in the playoffs against Brooklyn Prep when he passed off for 16 assists.
