A Message from Pastor Sarah

Creative Giving Ideas to Zion (aka - You may also save on your taxes)

I - Annual Gifts

There are a number of ways to give to Zion as part of your annual giving, but are you aware of some of the more creative ways? With the new tax laws in place for 2022, it's important to be aware of some strategies that can save on your income taxes. Because the Standard Deductions have gone up, your contributions may not be deductible.

If you have an IRA and are over 72, you have to do a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). If you've attained age 70 ½, you can do a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA. At age 72, the QCD counts as part of your Required Minimum Distribution. The check is payable directly to Zion. That way, it's not included as part of your income. This means that it may save taxes on your Social Security as well.

Another idea would be to donate shares of appreciated stock. This will avoid paying Capital Gains or concerns about Cost Basis. If you have some Government Bonds that have tax deferred gain or may not even be paying interest at this time, you could change the ownership to Zion. They're then cashed in with no tax consequences.

Consult your financial advisor or your tax preparer for specifics.

II – Planned Giving – as part of your estate planning

- 1. Name Zion as a beneficiary in your will or trust. Name a specific bequest, e.g., Endowment Fund, Capital Improvements, General Fund, if you prefer.
- 2. Add, or change, the beneficiary on an account: brokerage, CD's, IRA, Life Insurance, Tax Deferred Annuity, real estate (works best if named in a trust). Percentages work well in most cases.
- 1. Use pre-tax accounts, if possible.




Book Club
