Perhaps you see the signs in your own family. Has your child become irritable and easily angered? Have their eating patterns changed? Do they try to avoid activities that they used to enjoy? Have sleep patterns changed? Do they worry about everything? Do you worry about them?

Zion has received a grant from Fairview Interfaith Health Collaborative. This grant has allowed me to buy online resources that can help families understand and deal with anxiety and depression. This online workshop has one track for children and another for parents/grandparents. If you are interested in this, please let me know and I will send you the passwords you need to participate. You can preview the program at

Again, if you would like to participate send me a note and I will send you the codes. We can have 4 families at a time participate. This program will be available for an entire year so when one family has made it through the program, they can let me know and another family can use the code.

New Funeral Policy

We have been busy with funerals lately. There are a lot of details that go into each funeral service as we seek to honor our loved ones with dignity and lift up families in prayer.

It is important to know what a funeral home/director provides:

- filing of certificates and permits,
- assisting with legal issues,
- placement of obituary notices in papers,
- coordinating the service with the cemetery including Fort Snelling and the local Honor Guard (if requested),
- supervising the service including arranging the flowers,
- lighting candles,
- · handing out bulletins,
- directing indoor traffic,
- answering questions,
- assuring the safety of the cards/monies etc,
- writing all the checks to church staff, newspapers, family florists, etc.,
- assisting at the cemetery,
- and being on hand to answer all sorts of questions.

More and more families are choosing to have their loved ones cremated and then bypass the use of funeral home services. If you do this, you receive the cremains and the rest of the details are up to



you. Pastor assists with planning, has to make arrangements with the local cemetery, honor guard etc. She has to make sure staff is paid, answer questions and provide much of the support a funeral director would do. A member of the altar guild is also present at each funeral to help with service details (flower arrangements, ushering, set up and clean up.

Because a lot more work is involved in services that are not using a funeral home/director, the council has agreed to raise the amount paid to our staff for non-funeral home funerals. In addition, we will be requesting a donation to the altar guild for the extra help they provide.



Our **October** book will be *A Piece of the World* by Christine Baker Kline.


Christina Olson is tied to her home by health and circumstance, and seems destined for a small life. Instead, she becomes Andrew Wyeth's
