



We take this God-given responsibility seriously. Your church council and committees strive to take good care of the resources entrusted to us. Our Stewardship committee is tasked with encouraging all of our members to understand their own stewardship of resources including time, talent, and finances. Funerals

More and more families are choosing to use cremations services instead of funeral homes. Although this seems like an economical option, it creates a lot more work and stress for both families and churches. In most cases, the crematory will hand you the ashes and their work is done. The details end up being done by families and church staff. The following services are part of the funeral home package:

\square Filing of certificates
Assisting with legal issues
☐ Placement of obituary notices in newspapers
☐ Providing brochures/guest books/thank you cards.
\square Coordination the service with the cemetery, including Fort Snelling
☐ Scheduling the services of the local Honor Guard
\square Supervising the visitation/funeral service
☐ Caring for and arranging flowers
☐ Lighting sanctuary candles
☐ Handing out bulletins
☐ Directing indoor traffic
☐ Answering questions
\square Assuring the safety of cards and monies during the visitation and service
\square Assisting at the cemetery
☐ Writing out and distributing all checks to church staff/newspapers/family
florist/musicians/cemetery staff

In the absence of funeral home staff, the pastor is responsible for many of the above services. She makes arrangements with the cemetery and honor guard, makes sure musicians are paid, arranges the meal with the serving team, answers questions and with the help of our Altar Guild, assists in the set-up and clean-up of the visitation and service and attends to many other details in addition to the planning of the service and writing the sermon. The honorariums for these services are as follows: (approved by council in 2020)

Clergy—Cost is \$500 if not using a funeral home, if using a funeral home, this cost is \$200.

Organist - \$125 Soloist - \$100

Church Custodian - \$75

Sound/Video Technician - \$75

Altar Guild - \$50 if not using a funeral home
