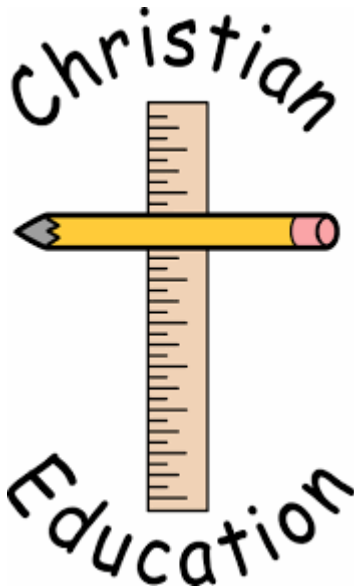

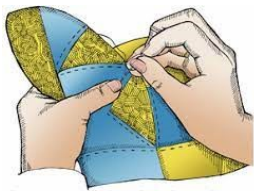

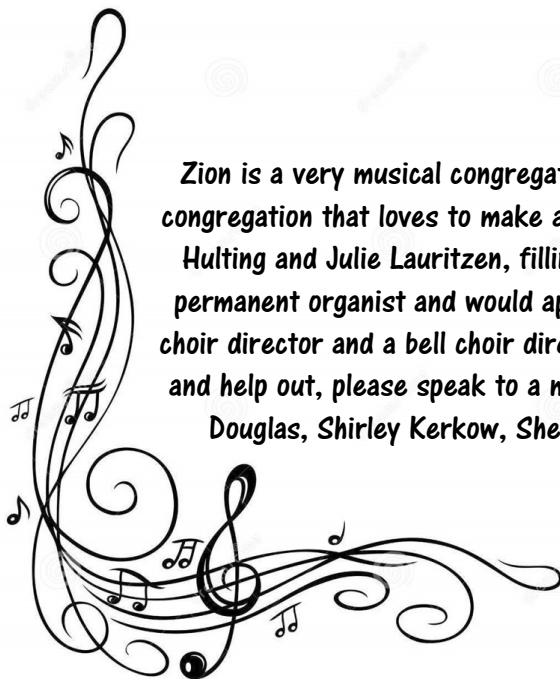

## Churchwide Assembly Report.

In July, I attended the triannual churchwide assembly held in Columbus, Ohio. All expenses were covered by the national church. It was a week of meetings, amazing worship, and a chance for me to see some old friends. We heard reports from the national church, witnessed and participated in public apologies for mistreating some of our brothers and sisters of different cultures. We elected a new churchwide vice-president Imran Siddiqui. Imran is from Atlanta and it turns out that a friend of mine from seminary is now a coworker of his and was instrumental in bringing him to church for the first time! We passed memorials directing the national church into a time of self-study and possible reorganization to better suit the needs of the 21st century. One of the surprising bits I learned about the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is that worship is held in 35 different languages across the USA! As time goes on, I will be sharing other information about the work of our national church body. It was a remarkable opportunity to represent the Saint Paul Area Synod at this gathering. ## Garage Update End of August 2022

First and most importantly, thank you to all Zion members (and Friends) who have financially supported fundraising. The end of the August balance in the Garage fund is \$16,000. In mid-July we purchased the garage doors. As with many things, they are on order and will arrive later in September. We need at least **\$50,000** to complete the project. The current estimate for the 'shell' is \$22,000 for materials. The additional cost is for insulating, electrical, heating, sheetrock and all the other materials and skilled services needed to finish the building. There is a tentative "start construction" date of October 15-16, 2022. Hopefully that weekend will be the "barn raising" where volunteers and skilled trades come together to get the garage done. We will share the additional information and plans as they become available. In the meantime, please continue to support us with your prayers and your contributions. This will be a busy fall!

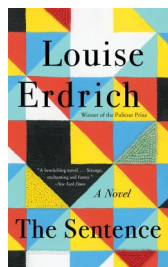

Our September book is "The Sentence" by Louise Erdrich. A Mpls. Book store is haunted by the store's most annoying customer. She has died on All Saint's Day, but will not leave the bookstore. A new employee must solve the mystery of this haunting during a year of grief and reckoning in Mpls. This is described as funny, passionate, and a tale of complex marriage and a woman's relentless errors.



Our October book choice is "Hamnet", by Maggie O'Farrell. In 1580's England, during the Black Plague, a young Latin tutor falls in love with an eccentric young woman. This is a portrait of a marriage and a family ravaged by grief and loss. It is a re-imagining of a boy whose life has been all but forgotten and whose name was given to one of the most celebrated plays of all time, Hamlet.

# PERSONAL CARE KITS

Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:



**x1**

One light-weight bath-size towel  
(between 20"×40" & 52"×27"),  
dark color recommended



**x2**

Two bath-size bars  
(4 to 5-oz.) of soap, any  
brand, in original wrapping.



**x1**

One adult-size toothbrush in  
its original packaging\*



**x1**

One sturdy comb,  
remove packaging



**x1**

One metal nail clippers  
(attached file optional),  
remove packaging.



Wrap all the items in the  
towel and tie securely  
with ribbons or yarn.

\*Toothbrush multi-packs may  
be used by sealing an individual  
toothbrush in a business-size  
envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

We'll need those to gather the items and filling the packs and several strong men to pack the boxes and prepare them for shipping. Hope you will give us an hour or so of your time for this. See you on that day!

There is still time to purchase and donate supplies. A monetary support of this project has been received from **Thrivent's Action Team** project and backpacks have been made in which the school items will be placed.

A box will be placed by the Welcome Desk for your donations. If you prefer to give a monetary donation for this cause, please put in the note "**LWF Backpack Project**". Donations will not only go to buy more supplies, but also help cover the cost of shipping.

#### Items needed are:

- 4 - 70 Sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 1/2", no loose leaf paper.
- 1 - 30 centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other.
- 1 - Pencil sharpener
- 1 - pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well.)
- 5 - Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- 5 - Black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- 1 - box of 16 or 24 crayons
- 1 - 2 1/2" eraser
