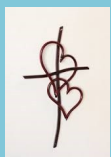

Palm Sunday, March 28

~ Online service at 8:30 am

~ Outdoor in-person service at 11:00 am

This week, the center of the church's year, is one of striking contrasts: Jesus rides into Jerusalem surrounded by shouts of glory, only to be left alone to die on the cross, abandoned by even his closest friends. Mark's gospel presents Jesus in his complete human vulnerability: agitated, grieved, scared, forsaken. Though we lament Christ's suffering and all human suffering, we also expect God's salvation: in the wine and bread, Jesus promises that his death will mark a new covenant with all people. We enter this holy week thirsty for the completion of God's astonishing work.

Stations of the Cross, March 28 - April 3

When you have time this week, come to the front parking lot and experience the Stations of the Cross. Pick up a booklet, then use that to guide you through the final days of Christ's passion story. For each station, the booklet will have a scripture for you to read, a thought to meditate on, and an artistic depiction of the event. Use this time to contemplate what Jesus did for you, before we get to the wonderful day of his resurrection.

Maundy Thursday, April 1

~ Online service at 6:30 pm

Maundy Thursday we remember Christ's last meal with his disciples, but the central focus is his commandment that we live out the promise embodied in this meal. As Jesus washed his dis-

ciples' feet, so we are called to give and receive love in humble service to one another. Formed into a new body in Christ through this holy meal, we are transformed by the mercy we have received and carry it into the world. Departing worship in solemn silence, we anticipate the coming days.

Good Friday, April 2

~ Online service at 6:30 pm

Life and death stand side by side as we enter into Good Friday. In John's passion account, Jesus reveals the power and glory of God, even as he is put on trial and sentenced to death. Standing with the disciples at the foot of the cross, we pray for the whole world as Christ's death offers life to all. We gather in solemn devotion, but always with the promise that the tree around which we assemble is indeed a tree of life. This service has been put together by all the area Lutheran churches.

Easter Sunday, April 4

~ Online service at 8:30 am

~ Outdoor in-person service at 11:00 am

Christ is risen! Jesus is alive, and God has swallowed up death forever. With Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, we may feel astonished and confused, unsure of what to make of the empty tomb. But this is why we gather, online or in person: to proclaim, witness, praise, and affirm the liberating reality of Christ's death and resurrection. In word and feast, we celebrate God's unending love, and depart to share this good news with all the world. Alleluia!

The deadline is April 30th to return completed applications to the church office.

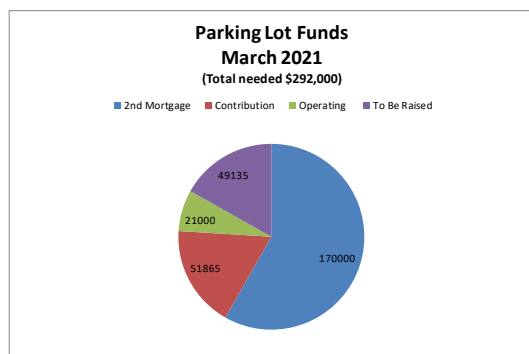

Parking Lot Update

A significant milestone was reached in March. The loan application was submitted on March 18. There were a few questions from the underwriter and we are continuing communications with Thrivent Church Financing. There is no estimate of how long the loan approval process will be but we will keep you posted.

Second, there has been significant increase in plastic pipe cost. This is in line with what is happening everywhere in the US. We are reviewing this and trying to decide what our action will be. Nothing is certain at this time.

In the meanwhile, we will continue to raise funds. No matter what happens, the parking lot still needs attention. So please continue to keep this project in mind. What has happened so far is remarkable. But, we are not there yet. Thanks for all your efforts.

"I ran away from home and I've been away for a long time. I wanted to go back, and wrote my father asking if he would take me back. But I never got a reply. So I wrote my mother, told her I was not waiting for a reply, that I was coming home and if they would take me back she must hang a white rag on the crabapple tree, down near the railroad tracks, so that I can see it when the train goes by. I wrote her that if I didn't see the white rag, I would understand and go on by." 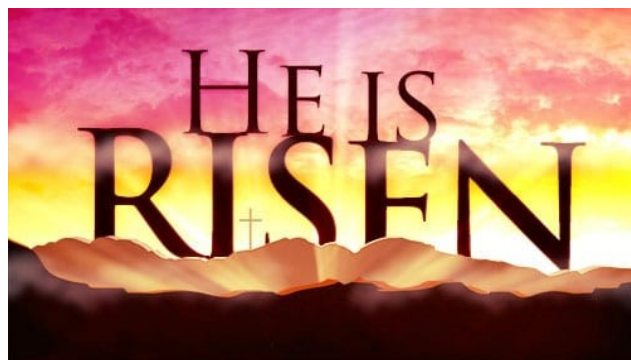

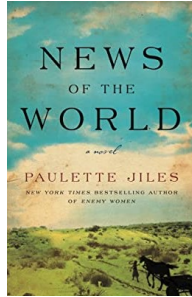

Book Club

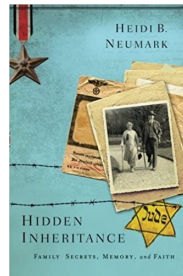

Our **May** book will be *Hidden Inheritance: Family Secrets, Memory and Faith* by Heidi Neumark.

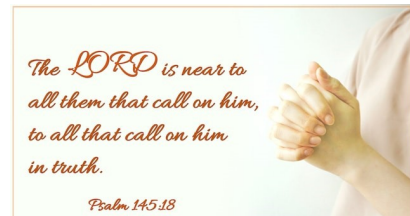
