Our September book is "The Measure" by Nikki Erlick. 8 ordinary people. One extraordinary choice. It seems like any other day. But today, when you open your front door, waiting for you is a small wooden box. This box holds your fate inside: the answer to the exact

number of years you will live. From

suburban doorsteps to desert tents, every person on every continent receives the same box. In an instant, the world is thrust into a collective frenzy. Where did these boxes come from? What do they mean? Is there truth in what they promise? As society comes together and pulls apart, everyone faces the same shocking choice: Do they wish to know how long they'll live? And, if so, what will they do with the knowledge?



As she grew up, moving to the East Coast for college, finding work in the restaurant industry, and performing gigs with her fledgling band, and meeting the man who would become her husbandher Korean-ness began to feel ever more distant, even as she found the life

she wanted to live. It was her mother's diagnosis of terminal cancer, when Michelle was 25 that forced a reckoning with her identity and brought her to reclaim the gifts of taste, language, and history her mother had given her.




#### **NOIZ** is back!!

Changes in the Office—From the Finance Committee Introducing Realm

Earlier this summer the Finance team proposed, and the Council authorized moving forward with a new, integrated church management system. When fully implemented, Realm will provide "One Stop Shopping" for our financial operations (giving and spending), member management (communications) and other services (Website design and maintenance, event registration) and all the other activities it takes to manage and grow the church.

We are starting with the accounting area. Beginning August I, we started running parallel systems to ensure we have an orderly transition from QuickBooks to Realm.

Overall, after implementation is complete, we expect to see lower costs for the software. More details will be provided as we move through the conversion.

As we head into our 150th year, we have some larger projects that members are invited to adopt. We will, eventually, have a display with more info. These projects include replacing the organ pipe caps (\$5,000), New candelabras (\$4,000) Stucco repair on the north side of the building (\$2,000—\$3,000), Repair of the sanctuary windows on the Old Towne Road side (TBD), Art project for the courtyard (space between the narthex and sanctuary, TBD)
