During school closures, YOU are the eyes and ears of the community. Be on the lookout for these indicators of child abuse:

- Pay attention to vague or concerning responses
  - Unexplained injuries
  - Imprint of article (i.e. a belt)
    - Afraid to go home
    - Wary of adult contact
- Wears clothing inappropriate for the weather
  - Poor hygiene
- Difficulty walking or sitting

If you suspect child abuse, make a report!  
YOU are a Mandated Reporter and by law, required to report -- NOT INVESTIGATE!
