




Our hosts met us each day at the hotel to be sure all

RV CLUSTER NEWS



San Antonio Riverwalk





The exchange participants spent a week in December 1983 for an orientation in New York and then the German Y directors came to our local Ys to learn about our work and culture and we did the same visiting Germany in the spring of 1984. As the branch executive at the Northshore branch, the Stuttgart Y director, Siegfried Rembold, stayed with our board members and then I stayed with Siegfried and his family (wife Inga and three girls from ages 3 to 13)., even skiing with them for a week in the Swiss Alps. It was a life changing experience! Through the years, we hosted their daughters, Siegfried and Inga and visiting them a couple of times in Stuttgart including our sons in the experience. We enjoyed time together with food and wine (the family owns a winery and a distillery for schnapps!) and did a bit of sight-seeing including the 1972 Munich Olympic Site, Central Munich Market, the Glockenspiel and the Munich Zoo. Jamie and I have been sailing a 40' catamaran called svGrateful in the waters of six continents (so far) as we attempt to circumnavigate.




Remarks made by Dan Powell, Executive Director of the Stanwood-Camano YMCA


