The National YMCA Alumni hosted a "Reunion-At-Sea" seven-night cruise from January 26-February 2, 2025, on the Royal Caribbean "Harmony of the Seas". It set sail from Galveston, TX with port stops in Honduras, Costa Maya, and Cozumel, Mexico. There were 125 registered Y alumni who took advantage of getting out of the cold weather and enjoying time with former co-workers and friends.

McCoy Board member, Barbara Cardenas, represented the McCoy Chapter during the two-year planning process (planning began May 2023); Barbara was responsible for monitoring the budget and creating/ analyzing a post-cruise survey. 

Syndrome. She attended her first "Night To Shine"

event at Lake Tahoe this month, sponsored by the Tim Tebow Foundation. This is an international event celebrated in all 50 states and 62 countries this year for special needs adults. Phelan-McDermid syndrome (22q13.3 deletion syndrome) is a rare genetic disorder that can cause medical, intellectual and behavioral concerns. Symptoms often appear early in life and range from mild to severe. They include muscle weakness, seizures, speech and developmental delays, autism spectrum disorder and certain physical features. I enjoy receiving The Real McCoy newsletter and Bill so loved reading it every month before he passed last year. I can't believe it's been almost a year without him."

Karen Nutter (McKinleyville, CA) "About 42 years ago, Jo Bagelmann taught me that a heart attack never presents itself where or how you expect it. On July 8, 2024 I got to experience what she'd taught me. As I walked from one room into another I became extremely light headed. I raced for a chair. Then a sharp pain shot under my right armpit & began to move around my side, coming to a stop just under my right shoulder blade. It rested there intensely for about 10 minutes, as I broke into a soaking wet sweat. While all of this was going on I kept thinking "what would Jo do?, she'd tell me to go to the hospital." I called my daughter, Lynette, & told her what was happening. We left for the hospital. The electrocardiogram showed a blood flow that was unusual so the two cardiac surgeons who talked with me about my options. They were not sure what would be found when they went into the heart. Their choices for me were from 3 or 4 stints to grim. From the onset, I had shifted

into being curious. My result was needing one stint, taking 8 medications, one of which was an absolute must & ended up costing \$1,300.00 each refill, eliminating adde d salt, n o sugar



cept fruit, and drinking 2 liters (8 1/3 cups) of water a day. I have succeeded in everything except that much water. My Doctor laughed When she heard the amount.

I thought I felt fantastic before the experience. I have a whole new level way above that fantastic; more energy, a clearer mind & a renewed appreciation of family & friends that were there immediately to help & remain supportive. My creativity has increased & I have lost 30+ lbs, & continuing. I realized that changing how I eat now to feed my heart made giving up sugar easy. I hope reporting this is helpful for you, or someone you know that needs to know this information. I thanked Jo immediately.

**Bob Smeenk (Aptos, CA)** "As a member of the Santa Cruz CASA Foster Care Support Auxiliary I had the chance to volunteer to help handout "Diapers", to needy families.

CASA is assisting a local family support organization. There a 4 packages of diapers and two packages of wipes available per child, per month. (I'd of sent my two back if it cost this much when we were having kids). We go through over 100 cases in just over 2 hours. They walk for blocks with strollers and toddles in tow, to receive these diapers.

After we close, I'm hot and sweaty, sore and tired, but feeling great. Had a GREAT DAY."

ver thirty years ago the McCoy Chapter of YMCA Retirees started giving out an award each year to a Program Staff Member in our chapter's service area who had demonstrated leadership and innovation. Last year the Board voted to make two awards; the original one for Program Innovation and one specifically designated for a new Outstanding Program Director

In the next month or so, Sue Steph, Julie Wesolek, and Barbara Cardenas will begin creating their plan to get the word out about our two Annual McCoy Awards for Program Innovation (\$1,000 award!) and Outstanding New Program Director (\$500 award!) to our 8 McCoy member Associations (Central Coast YMCA, YMCA of the East Bay, YMCA of San Francisco, YMCA of San Joaquin County, Shasta Family YMCA, YMCA of Silicon Valley, Sonoma County Family YMCA, YMCA of Superior California). Nominations will most likely open in June with submission deadlines in September. We hope our outreach efforts will generate more interest and more nominees this year. We want to encourage our McCoy Chapter members to encourage staff at their local Ys to start thinking now about who their Y stars are and encourage their supervisors to nominate them.

# 2024 McCoy Award Recipient Maureen Nansted

Maureen leads the Service Connector Program and Diaper Distribution Program. She is detail oriented, and able to manage different funders and grants. She is a leader in budget management and a true example of stretching the penny. Her success so far in this calendar year include:

• Launch of Diaper Bank Program, which now serves 200 participants monthly.

• Launch of Islais Place Program – her team has successfully relocated and supported 26 low-income families from Potrero Hill to Islais Place Bridge Housing.

• Increasing the usage of ECM which has allowed Urban to track the scope of work SC program is providing - 1475 services delivered throughout 2024.

Maureen has been with the YMCA for over 10 years. She is skilled in building up teams and creating relationships with community partners. She manages all of this as well as her own caseload.

Oliver returned to the YMCA as the Aquatics Director in August 2023. The Northwest aquatics program was in a big transition period at the time. Our former director had recently left, and our aquatics coordinator had been out on leave for almost an entire year.

Oliver stepped into a swim lesson program that had previously been the top producing revenue program in the Association. However, before Oliver arrived, we lost 3/4 of our staff due to school and other reasons. When Oliver started, he had to rebuild the program essentially from scratch and do his best to maintain budgeted goals that were given to him.

Oliver quickly assembled an aquatics leadership team and went to work. Through his hard work and dedication, he was able to rebuild and maintain the largest swim lesson program in the Association, serving over 800+ program participants each session.

I recommend Oliver Woody for the McCoy Chapter, Rookie of Year award because he had to adapt quickly to managing a large aquatics department. Oliver's dedication and passion for aquatics is second to none. He understands the importance of water safety and leads one of the largest staff teams in the Association.

# NATIONAL SERVICE PROJECT "Tiny Homes"

### **Nearing Completion**

ork continues on the four Tiny Homes in Dupree, South Dakota, which is stage 1 of the National Service Project supporting the YMCA of the Seven Council Fires on the Lakota Reservation. There are four "Waves" (week-long work parties) scheduled for 2025:

- #1 May 6-13
- #2 May 13-20
- #3 September 9-16
- #4 September 16-23 (this wave is sold out)

The Ribbon Cutting ceremony marking the completion of the tiny homes and transfer to the YMCA for transitional housing on the reservation will take place the weekend of September 19-21. More information and an invitation to attend or watch the ceremony online will come in the next 3-5 weeks.




Stage 2 of the National Service Project will begin in 2026. This stage will build a year-round "twig" (a small branch) in one of the cities on the reservation. Originally Y-Alumni had agreed to build two seasonal "twigs" for the YMCA. Winters are especially cold in South Dakota, and these would have been structures built around shipping containers outfitted with furniture and equipment. The single twig will be a much sturdier structure that can be used all year.
