#### SEABECK SPEAKERS



**Harold Shea**, Director of Operations for the Pierce & Kitsap County Y's, gave an overview of the operations of those facilities in the past, present and the future.

He grew up in Seattle and then was Director of the Boys & Girls Club for 16 years and then headed to Arizona in 2008 as Sports Dir. of the Chandler, Y. In 2011, he became the Exec. Dir.of four Y's: including

Tempe, Mesa, and Rock Farnsworth. In 2016, Harold came back to Washington as Director of Pierce & Kitsap Y's.

His overview included how and when these Y's came into operation and where they are today in buildings and membership. Last info shared was about the future of the operations of these Y's.

#### WHY AN IRONMAN

Sherry Milton has participated in many physical events over the years. Some being the Seattle to Portland bike ride: Ride Around Mt. Rainier One Day, Half & then a whole marathon; climbed Mt. Adams; and hiked down and up the Grand Canyon In one day. A new challenge was in the horizon as Sherry decided to attempt an Ironman event that would require a lot of training for the events of 2.4 swim; 112 mile bike ride; 26.22 mile marathon in that order for a total of 140 miles to be finished in 16 hour:45 minutes. She was most concerned about the swim as bike rides and running were events she had participated in.



Sherry was ready when the day came and headed to Tempe, Arizona. She was concerned about the swimming segment when she saw the nasty water at Tempe Town Square they would be swimming in. Since they were allowed to wear body suits, that helped some. This is a timed event and must be finished in 16 hours:45 min. be-

fore midnight. Sherries time was 16 hours and 23 minutes and just before the cut off time.

Next up; Training to go down the Grand Canyon to Havasupai Falls.

#### **IRONMAN BEGINNINGS**

In 1978 in Oahu, Hawaii, it was decided to link the Waikiki rough water swim, Oahu cycling club route and the Honolulu marathon into a one day event; thus was the start of what has become known as the Ironman event.



**Denise Landis**, Director of the Bremerton Y told us of all her experiences with the Y beginning in 1990 as a volunteer for aquatics at Camp Semour, then to Seattle and Aquatics Director at the Highline Y; at Bremerton, Yakima, Alaska, Olympia and, finally at Bremerton where she is now the Director. The facility has undergone changes, remodeling and now, to serve those

who do not need a full operations Y, a place in the city called an "Express Y"

#### **CHUCK KUNNING**

Chuck is the director of the Seabeck Conference Center. Each year he is invited to give us the latest up date about happenings at the conference center. This past year has been a very busy year with many bookings that brought in a 2.5 million dollar Income.

There have been some exceptional financial expenses. The state removed Seabeck's status on the tax rolls and required a payment of \$300,00 back taxes. The board is working on getting reinstated as a non profit.

The septic tank system needs to be replaced. The present tanks are old and will require \$800,000 to replace.

He noted that twenty Redwood trees have been planted around the property. Some of the older big ones have done well in this environment.

Also noted is a facebook page "Friends of Seabeck Cemetery". At different times, this chapter has done some clean up of the site, group walks, etc.

#### Members First Time To Seabeck

"Rig Riggins, a retired YMCA career professional, dedicated 49 years of his life to serving six different YMCA Associations, working alongside iconic Y leaders. Rig began his professional career in Des Moines, Iowa, after graduating from Drake University, and worked his way through the ranks to become the Central Branch Executive of a 200,000 sq ft facility under the mentorship of Sam Edgar and Rod Farmer. From there, he transitioned to the Los Angeles YMCA as a Vice President, where he was responsible for the Hollywood Y, the flagship of the Association, under John Ouellet. His career next led him to San Diego, where he served as Chief Operating Officer under Rich Collato, and it was during this time that he first met Diana. Afterward, Rig accepted his first CEO assignment in Long Beach, CA, following Bob Felder, and later moved to Spokane, WA, to lead as CEO following Rich Wallis. Rig and Diana were married 23 years ago in Spokane. His final CEO role was in Pittsburgh, PA, following Julius Jones, where he concluded his career before retiring in 2017. Since then, he and Diana enjoyed five years in Rancho Mirage, CA, before moving back to the Pacific Northwest two years ago to Silverdale, WA. Rig now enjoys family time, golf, travel, and reading.

Diana Riggins, whose YMCA journey began in Metropolitan San Diego, quickly became a standout leader. After starting in Financial Development, she rose to Branch Manager of the Penasquitos Family YMCA, directing the backvard swim program and overseeing the development of a new facility. Diana's passion for community development extended beyond the YMCA, as she later worked in Financial Development and Marketing for Big Brothers Big Sisters, where her dedication to mentoring continued even after leaving the workforce. A board member and Chair for both BBBS of the Inland Empire and BBBS of Greater Pittsburgh, she also organized mentoring programs through her Rotary Club involvement as President. An elder with her tribe, Diana is now back in her ancestral home in Kitsap County and helps her tribe with economic development and volunteers on several community committees, furthering her lifelong commitment to service. Together, Rig and Diana's journeys have been deeply rooted in community leadership and service, continuing to shape the lives of those around them."

#### NATIONAL SERVICE PROJECT UP-DATE

Total amount raised to date is \$957,767 and \$34,500 of that is designated for appliances. It is expected that the total raised by the end of the project with exceed one million dollars. **Allen-Stone**"s total raised to date is \$108,337, highest of the 17 chapters.

The four tiny homes are projected to be finished by the end of 2025.

Sign-ups will open on October 1<sup>st</sup>. For 2025 waves scheduled for May and September. By the end of the project, 400 volunteers will have worked on 22 waves.

The plan is to complete two Twigs (outlying program centers) by September 2026 using containers which are on site being used as equipment and furniture storage.

The dedication of completion is planned for September 20 an 21 in Dupree At the Y.




