# President's Message

### New President elect for 2023-24

I am very happy to announce that Jill Hallin, the chair of this year's excellent Seabeck event and next year as well, has been elected President-Elect for our chapter. She will take over as president for 2023-2024. Jill, who has attended 6 Seabeck events, first came to Seabeck with her father, Earl Collins, a long time Y director and member of Allen-Stone. Jill's maternal grandfather, Wendall Wood, was also a Y director.



Jill has a very interesting background. She spent 4<sup>th</sup> thru 8<sup>th</sup> grades in Rome, Italy, where her father, Earl, was a Y director. She says her international experiences shaped the rest of her life and gave her a love of service. She also developed a love of horses and spent many years as a horse trainer, including training "Chinook Pass," a world record holder, after the horse was retired from racing and became a show horse. She then became a police officer in 1992, serving 10 years in King County and Alaska. She has been a licensed Private Investigator for 20 years, working for attorneys and defendants on upcoming court cases. She hopes to retire next year!

The Allen-Stone chapter covers 6 states which has 557 retired Y directors or surviving spouses. 113 people attended one of our chapter's 5 live events and 3 Zoom gatherings. Approximately 75 contributed over \$5,500 to the chapter and 45 of them contributed \$72,170 to the National Service Project. This total includes \$2,000 we voted to contribute from the chapter at our business meeting at Seabeck. I believe we can all be proud of having a very generous chapter, which continues to do lots of good.

Y Alumni RV Cluster Event July 26-29 th , 2023 Sisters, Oregon

When: July 26-29 th, Wed, 2 pm/Thurs/Fri nights, leaving on Sat by noon (July 29 th, .)

Where: Bend/Sisters RV Garden Resort, 67667 Hwy 20, Bend Oregon (But really it is nearer Sisters, just a few miles out of town.)

Phone: 541-549-3021. Ask for Shauna if it is Sun-Thursday. If she is not available, tell the staff member that you are part of the "YMCA Alumni" group.

Check out the website to see the camp map and general layout and see photos of the campground and the deluxe cottages. We have RV sites 41-46. Three on one side of the camp road; three right across from them. Leighs are in 45. The only one left open is #41. All the RV sites can accommodate any of our rigs. (Update: Deluxe cottages: 97, 98, 99. #97 and #98 are still available.)

We have 6 RV sites and all 3 deluxe cottages on hold until the end of August. If you want extra days, ask for availability when you register.

RV sites: Pull through, full hook-up, grass, trees. \$77 a night before discounts.

Discounts accepted: Good Sam, Military, Veteran, First Responder. Once all the taxes are added, it is almost \$77 again! The deluxe cottages have a living room with sofa bed, kitchen, full bathroom, and separate bedroom with queen bed. Sheets and linens are provided. Website says the rate is \$194 a night. (Might be slightly higher for next year.) You get a 15 %

discount if you book 3 nights; 10% if you book 2 nights. Required deposit when you register is the first night's stay. You pay the rest when you arrive. If you cancel more than 48 hours ahead of time, you only pay \$10 on an RV site or \$25 on a cottage.

If you are unsure of your availability or capability for coming next year, reserve a site anyway! If you don't, you might not get a site or cabin or might not get the site you want with the group. This is a popular site that is usually full all summer.

There is a swimming pool and a miniature golf course right on site.

We will spend one day exploring Sisters. Sisters has art galleries, cute shops, and great places to eat. Another outing might be Suttle Lake for a picnic....or a hike for those who want to....or kayaking for those who want to or miniature golf.

Please make your reservations by mid-August, certainly no later than late August.

Then let everyone know with "reply all" which site you are in. Thanks to the Robinsons, Mercers, Caroline Brooks and her friend Sandee for joining Jim and me at Cape Kiwanda this year. Let's make it just as much fun for next year.







# National Service Project YMCA of the Seven Council Fires, Dupree, South Dakota

In July **Mike** and **Sharon Robinson** and **Jim** and **Jan Leigh** traveled to South Dakota to work for a week on the National Service Project, the goal of which is to build four "tiny homes" for transitional housing for families in need and eventually some small program buildings for this YMCA. Our week was full of lots of hard work, time for some cultural presentations, tour of YMCA Camp Marrowbone, and a sightseeing day to the Badlands, Custer State Park, and Mt. Rushmore. We had a great team!

We cleaned debris and trash off the site to make it safer to work on. We cut boards for sill plates to top the foundation and provide a place for the walls to sit. We moved dirt around forms to prepare for the concrete to be poured. Jim helped with concrete pouring one day. We tied rebar. The SIP panels (structural insulated panels) for the walls are very heavy and must be handled very carefully. We practiced moving and raising them (it takes at least 8 people to handle them!) We reorganized the storage unit in which they are stored. We did some cleaning and reorganizing at the Volunteer Center and the YMCA office. We learned to be flexible, creative, resourceful, and open to learning. It will be exciting to see the progress on the building site as other waves of volunteers arrive.

Tom Horsley, World Service Chair

We are grateful for the continued support of Y World Service from our Y Alumni Members. After our solicitation at Seabeck. the Allen-Stone chapter is well on its way to surpass our \$20,000 goal. A special emphasis this year is the crisis in Ukraine.

YMCA of the USA World Service continues to provide financial and technical support for the immediate and long-term response to the ongoing situation. There is still much work ahead in Ukraine and the neighboring countries. in collaboration with YMCA Europe and YMCA Ukraine.

Coordinated by YMCA Europe, more than 200 YMCAs in Europe - including 17 still operating in Ukraine - are providing support to internally displaced and refugee youth and families. To date, these YMCAs have served more than 40,000 people, providing them with mental health services, childcare, employment resources and more.
