#### THE PARIS BASIS

We are all familiar with the YMCA'S historic mission set forth in the Constitution of the YMCA of the USA. It used the "Paris Basis" statement as its foundation. But do we know the history of that statement drafted in 1855 at the first world meeting of YMCA's in Paris?

At the sixth session of the conference Rev. Abel Stevens from New York presented his proposition for an alliance "showing the desirability of some bond of union between the different Associations." The plan was heard with careful attention with Frederic Monnier from Strasbourg declaring "It is not ours at this moment to organize a Union, it already exists." He proposed forming "one united Association on this general principle" which became known as the "Paris Basis". The group responded enthusiastically to the proposal and at the concluding session of the conference on August 24th the final version was presented and approved as follows:

"The Young Men's Christian Associations seek to unite these young men, who regarding Jesus Christ as their God and Savior according to the Holy Scriptures, desire to be his disciples in their faith and in their life, and to associate their efforts for the extension of His kingdom amongst young men."

During the following year the Basis was studied carefully with no objections by any Association. The 1865 Convention at Cincinnati approved the Basis on a motion by William C. Langdon, co-founder of the Washington YMCA and father of the first Confederation of American YMCA's. Three years later the Basis was incorporated in the YMCA Articles of Confederation adopted by the Troy Convention and is still at the core of the YMCA's existence.



## Tiny Home Village and Twig Program

#### Message from Steve Gunn regarding National Service Project

I am so proud of our William Chambers chapter and their giving to the National Service Project to the Sioux YMCA. Thus far, we have 36 givers that have given or pledged \$17,830.00. Nationally, the YMCA Alumni have 480 givers and have given or pledged \$480,165.00 on a goal of \$600,000.00 That is fantastic. The completed campaign will build 6 tiny homes for the Sioux Y along with 6 twigs (community storage container and program centers) for 6 communities.

The cash on hand (over \$130,000,00) allows the project to move forward this year by getting all site work done, building foundations for a total or 6 tiny homes and bringing one tiny home to completion!!

We still need our chapter Alumni to consider a gift (no matter how large or small) and/or consider going to South Dakota on one of our 6 weekly waves. To date, Chambers Alumni have stepped up in going to South Dakota too! We have approximately 6-8 individuals who are committed to going this year and another 5-7 highly considering a trip in 2022.

Thanks again for all our YMCA Alumni who are supporting the Sioux Y and your prayers for the project and the Sioux people themselves. It does make a difference!
