Why is it Important to Have Strong Faith in God?

To be a victorious Christian, you need to have strong faith in God. As a matter of fact, faith is essential for believers and non-believers alike. It is an important concept of life. We need it to get through life because all of us go through trials.

Galatians 2:16 declares that "know that a person is not justified by the works of the law, but by faith in Jesus Christ. So, we, too have put our faith in Christ Jesus that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law, because by the works of the law no one will be justified." (NIV) The truth is you cannot call yourself a Christian if you don't have faith. It is a basic requirement in Christianity. Believing God exists and He sent His son Jesus to die for our sins is what makes us followers of Christ. It is not enough to say you have faith. You need to walk the talk, practice what you profess.

When you hear the word "faith," what do you think of? Whether you realize it or not, faith is an essential part of life, not just Christianity. For example, every time you sit down on a chair, you have faith that the chair will hold you. You are trusting that the chair won't collapse under you.

That's faith – being sure of what you're hoping for – being certain of what you don't see or experience yet. The Bible defines faith as "the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1).

During the first three Sundays in November, we will look at the importance of strong faith. We shall also look at what the Bible says about faith, ways that we can strengthen our faith, and why faith is necessary. Hebrews 11:6 states, "It's impossible to please God apart from faith. And why? Because anyone who wants to approach God must believe both that he exists and that he cares enough to respond to those who seek him." (The Message)

# **Sunday, November 6** – "Jesus notices our level of faith" – Matthew 15:21-28

The woman was a Gentile who had faith that Jesus was the only hope for her sick daughter. She wouldn't take "no" for an answer from this Jewish Rabbi, so Jesus – moved by her faith – granted her request.

#### Sunday, November 13 – "Jesus notices our level of faith" – Mathew 14:22-32


The man with little faith was Peter, Jesus's own disciple! Jesus was walking on the water and invited Peter to come to Him; Peter had the faith to walk to Jesus on the water, but when his eyes focused on the wind and the waves, he became afraid and began to sink. We too need to keep our eyes on Jesus instead of our circumstances – this will keep our faith strong during difficulties.

#### **Sunday, November 20** – *"Faith moves God to act"* – Mark 2:1-12

Mark 2:5 says, "When Jesus saw [his friends'] faith, He said to the paralytic, 'Son, your sins are forgiven you." The lame man got up, grabbed his mat, and went home! When Jesus saw the faith of the lame man's friends, He moved on their behalf and healed their friend.

As Christians, we often petition God, asking Him to meet our needs, to heal our bodies or relationships, or to give us wisdom. But as James 1:5-7 says, unless we ask in faith without doubting, we won't receive what we're asking for.

#### For no one can lay a foundation other than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ.

### I Corinthians 3:11

Allow me to share one of my earliest and fondest "church" memories. I'm probably four or five years old, sitting straight-legged on a hard pew next to my grandmother. I remember the aroma of Juicy Fruit gum escaping her purse and Nellie Bucher Marshall joyfully singing a hymn that would later become foundational to my faith: *My Hope is Built on Nothing Less than Jesus' Blood and Righteousness.* 

Pinned in 1834 by English pastor Edward Mote, *My Hope is Built* followed a "new" gospel hymns genre where the first stanza declares God's grace; stanzas 2 and 3 concern the application of that grace in times of trouble; and the final stanza brings the hymn full circle with the ultimate realization of God's grace.

My hope is built on nothing less Than Jesus' blood and righteousness;

I dare not trust the sweetest frame, But wholly lean on Jesus' name.

On Christ, the solid Rock, I stand; All other ground is sinking sand.

When darkness veils His lovely face, I rest on His unchanging grace; In every high and stormy gale My anchor holds within the veil.

His oath, His covenant, and His blood Support me in the whelming flood; When every earthly prop gives way, He then is all my Hope and Stay.

When He shall come with trumpet sound, Oh, may I then in Him be found, Clothed in His righteousness alone, Faultless to stand before the throne!

188 years later, the truth of Mote's hymn continues to bring comfort to millions of believers around the world. 70 years of remembering my precious grandmother singing it so joyfully, leads me to look forward to the day when I will see her again - because "<u>My</u> Hope is Built on Nothing Less than Jesus' Blood and Righteousness."

Keep in mind that all of our classrooms and meeting spaces are used by a variety of people throughout the week. No one group "owns" a certain room or meeting space so we all need to be kind and gracious as we go about the business of being the hands and feet of Jesus.

## SHARING OUR BLESSINGS IN NOVEMBER

This is a ministry which John Wesley has supported for many years. It's in a lowerincome neighborhood in Hamilton. During the school year, they provide after-school activities for children and teens, both homework help, fun activities and dinner. It gives them a safe, enriching environment in a Christian atmosphere.

Before Christmas, many of us enjoy filling boxes of gifts for the children at Living Water, and we will do that again. Our "sharing" donations help with the basics – paying staff, keeping the lights on, adding enrichment activities for the children and teens.

There are two ways to contribute:

- On Communion Sunday, place your donation (cash or check) in one of the baskets by a door into the sanctuary.
- Any Sunday in November, place your donations in the offering plate. Put "Sharing/Living Water" on the memo line of a check or cash in an envelope marked the same way.

Thank you for your ongoing generosity to this wonderful ministry!





As we write this, most of our committees have all submitted their budget requests for the upcoming year; and we await the upcoming giving cards collection to determine the funding of those requests. We look forward to a successful stewardship campaign and thank everyone in advance for their generosity in helping our church continue its ministries through all of its committees.

As we near the year's end, be sure that you submit any purchases you make for your group's ministries and that you want covered by 2022 budgeted funds well before the year's end in order that those bills may actually be paid before December 31. It will help the financial folks also if you notify the treasurer in writing or via email about any purchases that need to be paid before year's end if you are not sure when the company will invoice us. Some companies are quite slow to submit invoices for purchases.

Similarly, if you plan to sell stocks for a 2022 donation to the church, be sure that you arrange that sale/transfer well before the year's end since sometimes those transactions take quite a long time. If you have questions about this process, contact Tavane Cammarn.

Another request we have from the finance people is that anyone who submits a reimbursement form needs to have another committee member's signature besides their own. If the amount is for more than \$200, you need another signature as well. This protects your budgeted funds so that everyone is aware of expenditures being covered by your area of ministry. As is good business practice and in line with the Methodist Church Discipline guidelines, the signatures should not be from family members.

As you make purchases through online vendors, such as Amazon, please contact the treasurer before doing so in order that we can arrange to avoid both taxes and shipping costs.


And finally, remember that if you are submitting reimbursement forms for purchases you've made, you should be sure that you did not pay sales tax on those purchases. Use the church's EIN and sales tax exemption form to show vendors that we are exempt from paying sales taxes. If you need help with this, please contact the treasurer for the exemption form you can give the vendor.


Ordinary giving for September was \$47,838.81; and ordinary expenses were \$47,976.27.
