Minister's Message

Sumimasen Pinay Kaba?

It was noted by Rev. Hoshu Matsubayashi that it was felt that Jōdo Shinshū was considered to be, "pessimistic and difficult to propagate" being that Jōdo Shinshū had a unique "Japanese Characteristic."

As I look back to my recent trip to Japan, for the double celebration service and world convention, it was easy to see, that while it may seem true, that there is that unique "Japanese Characteristic", Jōdo Shinshū has become a religion on a global perspective. When you consider it, what IS a "Japanese Characteristic" now days? Japan has evolved with the modern times, if not exceeding it, with all the of technology, but has also adapted and accepted the Western World.

On one of the stops, we made on our tour, was to an onsen in Ibusuki. We all gathered in the lobby to hear one of the front desk agents explain to us the features of the hotel and where everything was. As I listened, I was thinking in my head, "That doesn't sound like English with a Japanese Accent." The more I listened, the more I was curious.




As everyone dispersed to their rooms, I went up to her an asked "Sumimasen Pinay Kaba?" meaning "Excuse me, are you Filipino?" She started to tear. I thought I was in trouble. "It's been such a long time since someone has spoken to me in Filipino!" she mentioned, and she tried to regain her composure. To lighten up the conversation, I mentioned "So wait, you can speak Filipino, English, AND Japanese?" She started to laugh, and nodded, "You speak better English than me!", I said. "Oh no sir, you speak better than me!" she replied.

To me, this experience is that of the Jōdo Shinshū Teachings and its acceptance in the world. The Teaching of always being embraced in Infinite Wisdom and Incomprehensible Compassion despite our foolish nature, has transcended a history of 800 years, not only in Japan, but all over this world, as evident to the many countries that were represented at the service and at the world

convention. It is due to the fact, that though the Teachings are over 800 years old, it remains true and has remained relevant throughout the generations that it has touched, no matter where in the world we are.

Japan has changed so much, and that "Japanese Characteristic" has changed so much with it. It is an easy misunderstanding (perhaps the foolish nature ingrained in us) to think that we are at a Japanese onsen, so there will be Japanese workers there, could be said, but now the international community is represented in this "Japanese Characteristic", adding their own "aji" or taste, to that characteristic, while trying to maintain the osen experience, that so many Japanese and other nationalities venture to, to experience.

We too, need to add in our own "aji" to the Jōdo Shinshū Experience, so that we can make sure it remains relevant, and available to our future generations.

Summary of June 14, 2023 Kyodan Board Meeting

- The Mililani Hongwanji Board of Directors met via ZOOM with a quorum. President June Asato presided.
- Treasurer's Report: Dennis Oshita went over the income and expense reports, explained various amounts that seem unusual, and identified non-operating cost items. Will need to check on martial arts dues payment. Cost for the roof repairs to the Ed Building still pending reimbursement from our insurance carrier.
- Minister's Report: Attended summer seminar with Bishop Marvin Harada and Rev. Shoukei
 Matsumoto. Topic included how to be relevant in today's society. Also attended BSC seminar and
 the Oahu/Honolulu Nembutsu Seminar. Topics included looking at social issues through the lens
 of the Teachings rather than personal feelings. Also diversity and acceptance in Buddha's Vow.
 Mililani was selected as a pilot temple for LGBTQ+ support.
- President's Report: June reported that ADC will provide transportation for clients. Bishop Matsumoto Aloha Luncheon will be on July 8th, let June know if you are interested. New Bishop Umitani installation will be on August 5th. State Lay Convention will be in Kona on September 8-10, 2023, attendance is encouraged. We will participate in the Senior Fair on September 9, Rec 5. Eric Nonaka has been appointed head of Aikido for the State of Hawaii.
- Facilities: Temple AEDs maintenance reviewed and supplies replenished. Accordion door was installed in the columbarium. Fire alarm system being reviewed and recommendation forthcoming. Security system being expanded. (Dean Sakamoto)
- Operations: Kevin Asato will chair Nominations Committee, members are Arynn Ishikawa, Kathy Nakamoto, Dennis Oshita, and Cliff Togo. Kevin is updating Columbarium operating procedures.
- Religious Activities & Programs: Keirokai planning being initiated (Claire Doi). Dharma School Rally Day on August 27th (Ann Ishikawa).
- BWA: Members shared their Japan experience, asking for support and participation in this year's obon. Ann Ishikawa will be helping Dharma School's Rally Day on August 27, volunteers are welcome with various food stations.
- Jr. YBA: Jr. YBA Oahu District will be hosting the Statewide Convention on June 23-25. Attendance is expected to be 35-40.
- Bon Dance: (Cliff) Various committees are progressing well and will be having a general meeting on August 2, 7:00 to tie up any lose ends. Donations to Silent Auction and Country Store are welcome. No facilities use during the week of Bon.
- Approved Actions: To allow Charijean Watanabe to solicit donations for the 2023 Bon Dance Silent Auction. Brandon Hee to purchase and replace PA system for Bon Dance. Appointed Ann Ishikawa as a 2023 Board of Director and serve as an Auditor. Amend rental capacity for Education Building from 200 to 125.


Dharma School


