



So as you enjoy the festivities of the Bon Dance, please remember, somewhere during the evening, please pause and reflect on Okage Sama De, and celebrate it. After all it makes us who we are in this moment of time.

Summary of July 13, 2022 Kyodan Board Meeting



- The Mililani Hongwanji Board of Directors met via ZOOM with a quorum. President Dean Sakamoto conducted the meeting from California (10:00pm).
- Treasurer's Report presented for the month ending June 30, 2022. The checking account balance remained relatively unchanged with income and expenses fairly equal. Overall Income is 52% and expenditures at 43% of the annual operating budget at the halfway mark.
- The temple sign at the entrance is currently being repaired. Mahalo S. Koito for your efforts.
- MTA Senior Fair planned to be a twice a year event. Mililani Hongwanji plans to participate just once a year.
- 50th Anniversary Tri-Chairs are: June Asato, Mel Hayase, and Rev. David Fujimoto. Planning to commence soon after the 45th Anniversary celebration in November 2022.
- Approved to move forward to allow Kumon the use of the temple building on Thursdays from 2:00-5:00pm in addition to current usage.
- Bon Dance: General Bon Dance meeting was held on July 6, 2022. All the subcommittees are busy preparing for the big community event. Mililani is one of the few temples having a Bon Dance (2 nights) this year. Changes are being implemented to address safety and manpower issues. Bring you chairs as seating will be limited. There will be no after dance refreshments. Please support the Silent Auction and Country Store with your donations. The Jr. YBA of Oahu and the Judo Club are planning to fundraise as well. KOKUA will be needed on Friday, 8/19, 8:00 am and Sunday, 8/21, 8:00 am to set up and breakdown. Come and participate in this important & fun event. Let's keep the tradition alive.





The Phoenix Rises



Like the immortal bird that rises from the ashes, our beautiful yagura has been resurrected for Mililani Hongwanji's 2022 Bon Dance and will once again be the crowning jewel bedecked in floral arrangements and draped in a stunning dress sewed by our long-time seamstress, our beloved Jean Sanehira.

Right now, our yagura sits forlornly in our parking lot waiting for her 2 days of glory at Mililani Hongwanji's Bon Dance on Friday and Saturday, Aug. 19 and 20, 2022.

After years of talk and no action, this year, 2022, our yagura was finally truncated by about 18 inches on the bottom and decapitated by about 5 feet on the top. This reconfiguration of the yagura will make it safer to assemble and dis-assemble for future use. There is discussion of further modifications, such as adding wheels to make the yagura mobile and capable

of storage without being taken apart.

A talented (and not so talented) crew of 15 men (and young men) successfully fit all the puzzle pieces together to erect the yagura. A dedicated crew of ladies worked together to feed lunch to the ravenous bunch of workers.

Everytime I look at the modified yagura, I rub my eyes and stare in disbelief: WE DID IT!!!!

This again was a great example of working together cooperatively and interdependently to accomplish a magical feat of wonder.


