Minister's Message



Goodbye vs. Nice to Meet You!

Recently, Netflix released a new show entitled "The Makanai: Cooking for the Maiko House." It follows two friends as they move from Aomori Prefecture to Kyoto, where they aspire to become a *maiko* or apprentice *geisha*. During the course of the show and their training, one friend excels in the art of flower arranging, dancing, and singing, while her friend is unable to keep up. Instead, rather than being kicked out of the training, the woman of the "house" finds her talents in being the cook for the "house" that they and other *maiko* apprentices live, she is referred to as the "*makanai*".



During one of the episodes, there was a conversation between one of the top *geisha*s in Kyoto and the *makanai*. The *makanai* asks the *geisha* what she is thinking about when she is dancing. Her reply was that for her, it was *ichigo ichie* and that in each instance, each step, she is telling the people she is entertaining, *sayonara* or goodbye.

In the true sense, that is what *ichigo ichie* is, one time, one meeting, and so it's doing something as if it were for the first time and also, the last time. In the eyes of the *geisha*, it meant that she performs as if this was the only opportunity or the final opportunity to entertain them, and so with each step she is telling the people she is entertaining goodbye, since it's the only time she will probably see them.

The *geisha* asked the *makanai* what she thinks about when cooking and if she enjoys what she does, after all, she was still in the house, but not as what she wanted to do. Her passion for cooking was similar to the geisha's feeling in *ichigo ichie*, but from a different perspective. As a cook, she picks up fresh produce daily to use in her meals. However, each time she picks up the produce she felt as if she was saying "hello, nice to meet you!"

This changed the geisha's way of thinking. From a "negative" always saying "goodbye", it turned to a positive, and each movement it was an opportunity to tell those she was entertaining, "hello! Nice to meet you!"

This perspective allowed her to open up more, especially since she had an apprentice now working under her (coincidentally, the *makanai*'s friend). The *geisha* was interviewed as to her thoughts on being one of the top women and she referred to the changing of her mentality from each moment being a goodbye to each moment being a greeting.

The Dharma allows us to see things from many perspectives, not just one perspective. It is in how we react to the situation we are presented with. As we share in the joy of the Dharma, let us take into consideration how we are reacting to what we are being faced with. Are we saying "goodbye" or are we saying "hello! Nice to meet you!"?


Dharma School






