Minister's Message



Do You Hear What I Hear?

"We must hear the heart of the Tathāgata, who, out of great compassion, is tirelessly and loudly calling us. How can we forget so quickly the truth that we are falling into hell and the Tathāgata's great compassion is always working on us? "

From the Essay "Makoto no Monpō" by Professor Takamaro Shigaraki

October is here, and I am already wanting for this year to end. There have been a lot of things happening in my life both professionally and personally. As we are hopefully coming out of this pandemic, we are finding out that there are new norms that in a sense, need to live with. We now find ourselves "out in the pastures" so to speak and trying to find our way home.

The truth of the matter is, I have to admit, I have lost my bearings also. In my frustration, anxiety, and feeling of disheartenment, it's easy to feel like it's a lonely world, while trying looking for a superhero to come save me, I came across this essay written by Professor Takamaro Shigaraki, and I was struck by the abovementioned statement.

In the craziness of the world, as we try to redefine ourselves, it's easy to forget the Compassionate Heart of Amida Buddha, that is always calling out to us. Through Amida's Primal Vow, Namo Amida Butsu is always working for and on us, though we many do not feel it. However, there are times when it hit us, hits us really hard, like a wakeup call.

I once did a funeral and succeeding memorial services for a family. For me, the memorial services are a great opportunity to not only see how the family is doing, but we also have the moment to make a connection and nurture a relationship, that is very sacred and very special. That is the true sense of the Sangha.



One day, I received a thank you card from the youngest in the family. Unprovoked by anyone, this 8-year-old took the time to send me a card with a simple message of appreciation. Just a few words, got me down on my knees tearing.

What a Nembutsu Moment! It was at that time, I could hear that Great Compassion calling out to me, that voice which I had forgotten, but hadn't forgotten me.

It was out there calling to me, but I couldn't hear it, or I must have been ignoring it, but once I heard it, it called out to me even more and more, and in response to that great reminder and that compassionate voice, I recited Namo Amida Butsu out of appreciation for that reminder. This young man is the superhero I needed to help guide my and navigate me through the troubled waters of my frustration, anxiety, and disheartened moments. Through my moments, it made me realize that I am not alone, there is always that embrace of Amida Buddha that is always working for on me, and always calling out to me.

Thank you to Reverend Fujimoto and the Oahu District ministers; to Gail Taira and Choir; to Rene Mansho, President of the United Lay Association of Oahu; and to other Mililani Hongwanji members (Clifford Togo, Brandon Hee, Claire Doi, June Asato, and Arynn Ishikawa) who attended and helped with this convention. Summary of September 14, 2022 Kyodan Board Meeting

- The Mililani Hongwanji Board of Directors met via ZOOM with a quorum. President Dean Sakamoto conducted the meeting from his home in California (10:00pm).
- Treasurer's Report presented by Cliff for the month ending August 30, 2022. Quite a busy month with ongoing Bon activities. Transfer of HHMH Social Concerns Fund drive & Reroofing (CIP) of the carport were recorded.
- Bon Dance (Cliff): The return of "Live" Bon Dance was a huge success based on the large crowds, funds raised, and feedback from members and the community. Several changes were done to make the event less labor intensive and easier to continue. The Yagura and lights were changed and no food preparations were done by members (Food Trucks on both nights). The various committees and volunteers worked together to insure everything went smoothly. A BIG MAHALO to all (too many to mention). Job well done! A wrap up meeting of more than 20 people was held to discuss how things went along with recommendations for improvements. Next year's Bon Dance is tentatively scheduled for August 18-19, 2023 (Admissions Day weekend). Cliff Togo and Stanley Sasaki have agreed to Co-Chair the event in 2023. This is one of the temple's most important and visible community event, so let's keep the tradition going.

- Revised Draft of "Facilities Use Request Guidelines" distributed for review and comment.
- The Kyodan General Membership Meeting is scheduled for December 11, 2022, after Sunday Service.
- 2023 HHMH Calendars on order. May need assistance to distribute/mail to members.
- Installation of free LED light fixtures (Hawaii Energy Project) will take place on October 3-5, 2022. Please plan accordingly.
- 45th (Rene & Dean) & 50th (June & Mel) Anniversaries planning in process. More info to be posted.
- State Lay Convention will be on September 16-17, via ZOOM. Guest speaker will be Dr. Michael Cheang. Oahu Lay Association drafted two Resolutions for consideration. (1) Restructuring the organization, (2) Establish a Social Media/IT position to support the HHMH Kyodan and various temples.
- Thursday Gang have been continuing to provide important and necessary repairs and maintenance to the temple facilities.
- Nominating Committee: 2023 slate nearly completed. Still looking for a few volunteers to serve the kyodan.
- BWA returning to the team approach for after Sunday Service refreshments. Sign up if you are able to provide light refreshments. Your DANA is appreciated. See Lani or Diane.

Now that summer is behind us, we can all breathe a sigh of relief that the hot

weather is gone. However, with the pleasures associated with a cooler autumn, come the frantic pace of holidays, celebrations, travel, and family gatherings, so please pace yourselves. Relax, and, when you can, meditate. Research can't say enough about its benefits.

One of our long-standing members, Betty Kakazu, has moved into the Mililani Plaza with her husband, Aki. If you

Thanks to Theo Hirai and Diane Yoza for coordinating the Peace Day Project. Containers filled with origami cranes attached to straws were placed in three local businesses -- the Mililani Adult Care, Longs Town Center, and Longs Mauka. The businesses were very receptive to displaying the cranes, each of which had a message promoting peace.

The BWA had a very successful Zippy's fundraiser earlier this year, so an agreement among

members was to have another Zippy's fundraiser. The alternative was to hold a bazaar, which would've been extremely labor intensive, and the limited space would prevent us from accepting too many items.

The conference speaker is Cullen Hayashida, who is the director and founder of Kupuna Educational Center at Kapiolani Community College. 
