

# New Year's Message

Happy New Year Everyone!

I would like to take this opportunity at the beginning of the year, to express my deepest gratitude to you all. 2023 was quite a year filled with different emotions. As I look back to 2023, I am reminded of the last stanza of the New *Ryōgemon*, which reads:

Living with the Dharma as my guide Softens my rigid heart and mind. Gratitude for the gift of life I have received, Frees me from becoming lost in greed and anger, And allows me to share a warm smile and speak gentle words. Sharing in the joy and sadness of others, I shall strive to live each day to its fullest.



The New *Ryōgemon*, which was written by our current Monshu, is a testament to our gratitude to the Teachings, and it is his hopes that all of us to memorize and recite it at many of our occasions, such as Sunday Services, to remind ourselves to nurture *Namo Amida Butsu*, not only within ourselves, but with those who we are surrounded by and the future generations.

What leads you to say *Namo Amida Butsu*? This year's Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawai'i Theme and Slogan, "Building Healthy Sanghas: Sharing *Nembutsu* Moments", explores those moments in which we utter *Namo Amida Butsu*, whether under our breaths, or as one big collective in a service.



Recently, I was having a bad day. Not to mention, I had received some bad news. I made a stop at Starbucks, and when I received my order, inscribed on the lid of my drink was the words, "Happy Friday!" Two simple words, and yet it had such a profound meaning for me at that moment. It was a moment of selfreflection that made me realize how feeble my thinking was. In that moment, Namo Amida Butsu quietly came out of my mouth. It was my action and yet at the same time, it was Amida's Calling Voice to me.

*Nembutsu* Moments are genuine, real, and fleeting. It may happen with us not even noticing.

It's never forced, and yet it is a very significant part of our spiritual and religious practice, which is why I asked that very question, "What leads you to say *Namo Amida Butsu*?" When we begin to understand that question, then another question arises, "How do we share it?" How do we share something that is so intimate, and yet, should not be ashamed to share? Often it is shared in our actions, in our words, and in our deeds.

If we can encourage more *Nembutsu* Moments and less moments filled with ignorance, anger, greed, and selfishness, we are able to build a healthy sangha for generations to come. As we begin a new year. Let us all rally around this year's theme and slogan and live with the *Nembutsu* in our hearts, and with the Dharma as our guide.

## Summary of December 13, 2023 Kyodan Board Meeting

- The Mililani Hongwanji Board of Directors met in person with a quorum. President June Asato arranged for a pre-meeting dinner. Minutes of previous month's meeting was approved.
- Treasurer's Report: (Cliff) Distributed the 2023 Financial Operating Report. This report was also distributed at the Annual General Membership meeting on December 10, after service. The report included actual figures up through November 30, with projections for the month of December. Major categories of income and expenses were highlighted. The net operating results were favorable in that income exceeded budget, and expenditures were less than budget. Listed other temple asset accounts and the estimated current balances. Moved and approved that excess checking account cash be transferred to higher rate of return accounts. Also approved the purchase of online QuickBooks financial software for temple finances. 2024 Gojikai Pledge Letters and HHMH Social Concerns Fund Drive Letters were mailed in November. If you did not receive one, contact Cliff. Dennis O. will be working on the Kyodan budget for 2024 in January.
- President's Report: (June) Expressed gratitude and appreciation to the Board as she concludes her 3rd non-consecutive term as president, encouraged board & non-board members to step up and take leadership roles to sustain and grow the temple in the years ahead. Bishop Umitani announced that Reverend Fujimoto has been assigned to Moiliili Hongwanji effective 3/1/24. He will also continue to serve Ewa Hongwanji. A transition team has been named to address interim procedures. No minister has been assigned to Mililani Hongwanji. Looking for members who may be interested in attending the Giseikai and Lay Convention. Early registration discounts encouraged. Subsidies may be available for participants. 50th Anniversary Committee are soliciting ideas for the milestone celebration.
- Minister's Report: (Rev. Fujimoto) Flyers and registration forms are out for the Triple Celebration in September. See insert for more info. 2024 HHMH calendars will be distributed to members and remaining will be mailed to members address.
- VP Operations: (Kevin excused) No Report.
- VP Facilities: (Stephen) Continue to work on improving temple safety systems along with Brad Wakahiro.
- VP Religious Services (Brandon) Service schedule for 2024 completed, will be busy assisting with various temple activities during minister's vacancy period.

#### **Memorial Services**


