Minister's Message



The Shinsei Gohonden Sahō Preserving the Tradition While Looking to the Future (Part 1)

I am sure a lot of you are looking forward to the big celebration in Kyōto in May. We will be celebrating the 850th Birthday of our founder Shinran Shōnin and the 800th Anniversary of the establishment of the Jōdo Shinshū Teachings.

For 800 years now, the Jōdo Shinshū Teachings have since left the shores of Japan and is now nurtured around the world. In my opinion, I believe that our spiritual leader, Gomonshu Kojun Ohtani recognizes this and is working very hard to ensure that the Teachings is understandable to all who come across it.

One of the facets of the service that will be conducted in Kyōto, will be the Shinsei Gohonden Sahō (新制御本典作法). In this service "ritual", we will be celebrating the major writing of Shinran, the Kyōgyōshinshō. The ritual will be following the chapters of the Kyōgyōshinshō, a kind of sake "flight", where we will get a "taste" of each of the chapter.

For those of you who can read Japanese, you see this term, 新制 or "shinsei", which means "Newly Established." It was a head scratcher for me, considering this "ritual" has played out for many years now. However, in the explanation of the service, there are four things that plays into the explanation of this "Newly Established":

Both ministers and lay can both hear the chanting.


Both ministers and lay can both chant the chants.

Keeping in mind the Tradition.

Keeping in mind the Tradition, while presenting a modern service.

In many Buddhist Traditions, the four points are not something that is necessarily followed. In the Jōdo Shinshū Tradition, we are one of the few traditions in which both the lay and the ministers are active participants in the service. Normally, it is just the ministers chanting in the temple and the lay are outside of the temple looking in from the temple window.

We are fortunate that the Nembutsu Teachings are accessible to all. As active participants, both lay and ministers, we are all equally embraced by Amida's Infinite Wisdom and Incomprehensible Compassion.

- Treasurer's Report: Cliff Togo distributed February's financial report for 2023. Budget amounts were not included as the Budget & Finance Committee (Dennis Oshita) will present a proposed 2023 Budget. Once approved, the Budget Allocation amounts will be inserted in the report.
- Minister's Report: Met with Rev. Suehira, 2nd volume of his book forthcoming, MH asked to participate in LGBTQ+ Pilot Program, Fire Dept inspected ADC facilities and updated their data, Scholarship Committee reviewing applications.
- President's Report: MHS celebrating 50th Anniversary. Continue positive relationship with area HS. May want to replicate Honolulu District Council's Passport project to promote Oahu temple's & Bon Dances, transitioning to a new insurance agent, Kevin A appointed Nomination Committee chair, private use of kitchen to be considered. MH will be hosting next year's Sangha Day.
- VP Facilities: Steven Koito reported that the Business Office split ACs were repaired. Ed Bldg roof damaged from high winds, working with insurance adjuster and contractors to expedite repairs. Considering methods to avoid outside dumping into our trash bin.
- VP Religious Prog: Planning in process for baccalaureate service/program. Sign up info will be in April's Dharma Connection. Memorial Service for May will be combined with April's on April 2nd.
- VP Operations: Rene Mansho and Janice Yasunaga will be Columbarium co-coordinators replacing Richard Taira. Brandon Hee will coordinate newsletter mail prep & complete required forms for mailing.
