Minister's Message



The Shinsei Gohonden Sahō Preserving the Tradition While Looking to the Future (Part 2)

The 850th Anniversary of the Birth of Shinran Shōnin and the 800th Anniversary of the Establishment of the Jōdo Shinshū Teachings have finally begun in Kyoto and so far thousands of Shinshu faithful have descended to our Mother Temple to be a part of the celebration.

Two times a day, one is able to see the service via the Nishi Hongwanji's YouTube Channel. I have seen several services, and I encourage you to tune in to see and hear the sights and sounds of this service.

Services at our Mother Temple is always amazing to watch, From the precise movements of the ministers to the entrance of our Spiritual Leader, the chanting, and even the Dharma Message, whether given by one of the ministers, a Hongwanji Scholar, or even our Spiritual Leader Himself.

For several weeks now, we have been going over the components of the service in our Family Dharma Services. It is my hope, that you are taking with you the finer points of the Teachings and also familiarizing yourself to the service.

There is a section in the service dedication where the service officiant says:

Humbly, before Amida Buddha, of great compassion and great sympathy and Shinran Shōnin, the Founder of Jōdo Shinshū, respectfully and solemnly, here today, we read the sacred scriptures together with ministers and followers and adorn the altar.

We gather to observe the Commemoration Dharma Service for the 850th birth of Shinran Shōnin and the 800th Anniversary of the Establishment of Jōdo Shinshū.

I find great joy and comfort in these words. This statement fits in well with the 2023 Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawai'i's Theme and Slogan, in which together we are able to share in the joy of the Dharma together. The Nembutsu Teachings is made for all of us.

As I write the last sentence above, I am sitting inside of Starbucks and I look around and see everyone going about their business, the baristas at work making drinks while laughing and interacting with their fellow baristas and customers. Whether or not they all feel it or not, as they go about, the Teachings is playing out in each Nembutsu Moment that they are creating for themselves and others. This moment, this fleeting moment, I believe is at the heart of the celebration. The joy of the Dharma that preserves the tradition for us now and looks to the future of changes and optimism.

The second set was part of a University of Hawaii Celebration which included a bon dance in the area between the East West Center and the Kennedy Theater. The

focal display was a hanamido with the baby statue and since Mililani members were on the Buddhist Study Center Committee planning the event funding was provided by the sponsors and the hanamido and statue were given to the Kapolei Buddhist Sangha after the event. When Kapolei closed down the hanamido and statue were given back to Mililani.

Summary of April 12, 2023 Kyodan Board Meeting

- The Mililani Hongwanji Board of Directors met via ZOOM with a quorum. President June Asato presided.
- Treasurer's Report: Cliff Togo distributed March's financial report for 2023. Budget amounts
 were inserted based on the approved budget by the Board from our last meeting. First
 Quarter HHMH Kyodan assessment was paid. Cost of roof repairs from wind damages will
 be reflected shortly. Cost to be initially paid from CIP funds subject to insurance reimbursement less deductible.
- Minister's Report: Preparing for Japan trip and coordinating coverage at Mililani Hongwanji while away. Rev. Alan Urasaki will be Mililani and Ewa's contact person for religious emergencies. The Kyodan Scholarship recipient has been selected and informed.
- President's Report: June reported all the activities involved with the community and various units of the Sangha. Kevin Asato will chair the nominating committee. Rev. David Fujimoto will chair the religious services committee, much time was dedicated towards the roof damage and dealing with insurance company. Executive Committee will be in charge while she and the Rev. will be in Japan.
- VP Facilities: Steven Koito's written report—rain and wind damaged the Ed. Bldg roof. After
 quotes received, repair was scheduled ASAP to prevent further interior damage. Thursday
 Gang continue to maintain facilities as needed. Concern for fire safety was raised and will
 be looked into by VP for Facilities.
- VP Religious Prog: Planning in process for baccalaureate service/program. Luncheon & Program will be in the Ed Bldg. Two Mililani HS graduates will be recognized.
- VP Operations: Kevin Asato reported that a Columbarium Manual is being reviewed and updated as needed. Rene Mansho and Janice Yasunaga are the Columbarium co-coordinators.
 Brandon Hee will manage newsletter mail prep & mailout forms.
- Budget & Finance: Since Dennis Oshita is now chair of the Finance Committee and serving as an unofficial assistant treasurer, it would be a conflict of interest for him to also be an auditor. His resignation as auditor was accepted by the Board. A second auditor is needed.
- BWA: Diane Yoza reports 45th Luncheon celebration on 4/16/23, Scholarship Committee will announce the recipient soon, Ehime Maru Cleanup 4/22/23, Eshinni/Kakushinni Service Offertory to be donated to Jr YBA of Oahu and Ohana Arts.
- Jr. YBA: Preparing for the State Convention in June. Oahu is hosting. They will be helping temples with their Bon Dance. They will be selling drinks again for Mililani's Bon Dance.
- Announcements: Cliff Bon Dance planning is underway. 1,000 Bon Dance towels arrived from Japan. See flyer in current issue of DC. Many of last year's committee chairs will continue again for this year. Please KOKUA to make the 2023 Bon Dance a big success again.

Mark your calendars and make your plans to join our Sangha members for this important community service project! Our second quarter clean-up is coming up on:


Saturday, May 27, 2023

It is a personal opportunity to gather as a family to encounter and listen to the Buddha Dharma and remember your family members and friends who have passed on and through these services, we are able to reflect on all that we have received from them in our daily lives. It also gives families the opportunity to reconnect with members they otherwise would not see during the course of the year.
