## Minister's Message



## The Time I Didn't Sleep for Five Days

Several weeks ago, I was suffering from some major insomnia. Since high school, I've had several moments in which I couldn't sleep for a night, but never five consecutive days. As I reached out to my friends, there were so many things they wanted me to try. Warm milk, Melatonin, cut out my caffeine intake, etc. But none seem to help me.

In the days of Shinran's training on Mt. Hiei, there was a practice of continuous chanting of the Nembutsu, while circumambulating around the statue of Amida Buddha. To help them, there was a giant rope that went around the perimeter of the statue, in which the monks could hold on to. The only time they were able to stop, was to eat, use the restroom, and get limited amount of rest.

There are stories in which, after several days, some monks started to hallucinate. One account mentions that Amida came alive, jumped off the altar and helped the monk concentrate. According to modern studies, after 72 hours of no sleep, there is some significant deficits that the body goes through, one of them is hallucinations.


When I was in graduate school, I attempted to pull an overnighter, in order to finish my thesis. After several hours, there was something going on by my bed, in the corner of my eyes. I looked over and saw purple Smurfs jumping up and down on my bed. I told myself, "That's it! I am going to bed!"

For the monks on Mt. Hiei, hallucinations like this were a mark of great faith, and the Buddha manifesting to them. For me, the hallucinations and the insomnia are yes, signs of fatigue, but also the unconscious, repress thoughts and feelings that we often don't communicate.

I turned to medical advice, and the quick method was to be prescribed medication to sleep, but with all that's going on, in and around the temple, and all the added responsibilities, I didn't want to take medication and forget to do something because I fell asleep, or fall asleep in the middle of service, that would just be unprofessional.

For Shinran, this continuous recitation of Nembutsu was unnecessary to be born into the Pure Land. For me, these sleepless nights are unnecessary also, for my health and my sanity. Buddha educates us to look inside of ourselves and bring attention to the subconscious and bring it to the conscious to address our suffering. Through that, the recitation of the Nembutsu is a call and response of gratitude and appreciation for the inner working of the Buddha.

Our recitation is not ours solely, it is also the voice of the Buddha calling out to us, to remind us of Buddha's constant embrace, and in that, the recitation is also the voice of our appreciation and gratitude. Time to go sleep now......

## Summary of April 13, 2022 Kyodan Board Meeting




- The Mililani Hongwanji Board of Directors met via ZOOM with a quorum. Immediate Past President Dean Sakamoto conducted the meeting.

The audit also included a review of the Finance Committee's 2021 Year End Financial Statement. Various tests samples were taken and traced for authorization and documentation. The audit found no exceptions or irregularities and that the income and expense monthly report is fairly represented.

- Approved to purchase an additional 170 Gratitude Coins from Wailuku Hongwanji as a temple fundraiser to support an unspecified KUPUNA organization.
- Approved Koden in memory of Rev. Midori Kondo.
- Parsonage Washer and Dryer currently being replaced and funded with CIP funds.
- Planning for the 2022 Bon Dance is coming along well. Most areas are covered. Still reviewing Yagura options. Leaning towards Food Trucks for both nights. Will skip after dance refreshments. Planning an in-person Bon Dance meeting on Wednesday, May 4, 7:00 pm, temple building. All welcome to attend.
- Kumon lease agreement continued for another year through June 2023. All other terms and conditions remains the same.
- New martial art floor mats to be delivered shortly.
- Several Mililani Hongwanji organizations will participate in MTA's Sr. Health & Hobby Fair on May 18, 9:00-1:00, Rec Center 3.
- Several volunteers cleaned out the garage and replaced light bulbs.




