



WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM Seminole County

The Weatherization Assistance Program provides grant funds to non-profit agencies, community action agencies, local governments, and Indian tribes to provide specific services for low-income families of Florida.

The Weatherization Assistance Program is funded by the United States Department of Energy and receives supplemental funding from the United States Department of Health and Human Services. The amount of funding determines the extent of the services to be provided to clients.

The Weatherization Assistance Program aims at lowering the monthly energy burden on low-income households by improving the energy efficiency of the home. All work to be proposed must fall within a specific budget.

A thorough visual inspection and diagnostic tests are performed to diagnose and determine what can be done to reduce the energy cost of the residence. Work is completed as needed and may include the following:

- Repair/replace windows/doors
- Install smoke and Carbon monoxide alarms
- Evaluate mold/moisture safety hazard
- Install efficient light sources
- Insulation weather stripping
- Air filters
- Low flow showerheads
- Refrigerator
- Caulking
- Exterior Doors repair/replacement
- Attic Insulation
- Solar Screens
- HVAC replacement

Applicants must meet certain criteria before being accepted for the program. Clients are prioritized based on the characteristics of the family unit, not first come first serve. Applicants must provide all required information requested during the client intake process to become eligible. Once a potential client has been through the client intake process, a priority number will be assigned to them based on the characteristics of the family unit. This priority number will dictate the order in which they will receive weatherization.
