OUR PROGRAMS & SERVICES:

The Smart Shopper Program (A Grocery Store Toolbox)

The Smart Shopper Program is a Food is Medicine initiative designed to help low-moderate-income people on fixed budgets, develop healthier eating habits through nutrition and food literacy education, for better health. Participants are empowered to make informed choices about the food they eat, while also learning how to save money at the checkout counter. The program offers a virtual grocery store tour with free, self-paced lessons based on each section of the store. Participants are introduced to new foods, learn about nutrient-dense foods, the importance of quality food and portions, how to read food labels, learn about processed foods, and more.

Internship Training Program

The FANN Internship Training Program educates and trains students to be future leaders and educators in the community food and nutrition field. Public health and dietetic students learn the basic principles of program development and community outreach education. Students receive holistic experiences which prepare them to work in diverse public sector areas such as schools, government, community healthcare, public health, hospitals, food assistance organizations, faith-based agencies, and other nonprofits.

SERVICES

Quarterly Speaker Series*

A one-hour virtual segment where professionals and experts from Texas and around the country, share their knowledge with FANN network professionals on various food and nutrition topics. Educational topics may include food is medicine programs, healthy and affordable food access, community nutrition/healthy eating education, federal nutrition assistance programs, research topics, state/federal agency guidance, and more.

Food Access and Nutrition Conference*

The annual conference convenes diverse food and nutrition professionals to create awareness, share innovative ideas, centered around improving healthy affordable food access and community nutrition programming for the public.

Educator Masterclass Series*

The Educator Masterclass series provides food, nutrition, and health professionals with a variety of topics related to affordable food access, community nutrition and food is medicine education.

Food & Nutrition Jobs Board

The jobs board is a service that connects professionals to food and nutrition job opportunities in 254 Texas counties. These include positions in diverse community settings such as schools, community healthcare centers, nonprofits, government, hospitals, food assistance organizations, faith-based agencies, and others.

The Newsroom

The Newsroom is a service which provides a repository of news stories, funding opportunities, food safety alerts, research articles and data related to food and nutrition news. The Newsroom is a free service for community agencies.

Nutrition Networking Symposium

The FANN Nutrition Networking Symposium brings together leaders and stakeholders in food, nutrition, and health to create awareness and strengthen nutrition initiatives, programs, and services to improve community health in Texas. The symposium showcases community nutrition and food as medicine initiatives and programs with learning sessions, networking opportunities, and vendors.

Food Access and Nutrition Network Community Impact Report THE PROBLEM:

More Americans are sick today than healthy due to bad diet and poor nutrition. In Texas, many communities lack the availability of free programs and services which could improve health outcomes.











- More American adults are sick today than healthy:
 - 1 in 3 have diabetes or prediabetes.
 - 1 in 2 have a lifetime risk of cancer.
 - 3 in 4 are overweight or obese.
 - Only 1 in 15 (6.8%) are metabolically healthy.
- Each week, poor nutrition:
 - Kills 10,000 Americans
 - Causes 1,500 new cancers
 - Causes 16,000 new cases of diabetes
- Among American teenagers:
 - 1 in 4 have prediabetes.
 - 1 in 6 have fatty liver.
 - 1 in 4 are overweight or obese.
 - Obese children are 80% more likely to be obese in adulthood.
- Poor nutrition causes over 1.1 trillion in economic loss to families and communities due to excess healthcare spending and loss of productivity in the U.S.
- Inequitable access to healthy food is a major contributor to health disparities and poor health.
- Heart disease is the most common, costly, and preventable of all health problems and hypertension is the most important modifiable risk factor for coronary heart disease which can improve with a better diet.
- Poor nutrition is a health risk behavior which is preventable and can improve with education.
- Poor nutrition can make illness worse which can lead to an early death.
- Those living in food insecure households consume fewer servings of fruits, vegetables, and whole grains and more sugar, salt, and fat.
- Only 1 in 10 Americans eat enough fruits and vegetables for a healthy diet.
- Diet-related disease is disproportionately concentrated in low-income, low-access communities where fruit and vegetable consumption are low.
- Moderate to low-income Americans on a fixed budget, may not be familiar with the term nutrition and the importance that nutrition education can play in living a healthier lifestyle.
- The average grocery store shopper does not fully understand how to read a nutrition facts label on a food package.
- Americans live in a fast-paced society where convenience is of high importance. The average family or
 household has little time for cooking, and many adults and teens have limited knowledge of how to cook which
 leads to consumption of ultra processed foods (more snacking) and reliance on fast food.

- Fifty eight percent (58%) of all calories consumed in the U.S. are ultra processed foods. Consumption of ultra processed foods can lead to diet-related disease later in life.
- Texas is a nutrition desert with limited programs and services in its 254 counties. Of 254 Texas counties, 94 of them have less than 1 nutrition program and several Texas counties have no services available for the public.
- Most free nutrition services for the public come from the public/nonprofit sector which are limited.

OUR IMPACT and REACH for 2023:

FANN promotes healthy, affordable food access and better nutrition through awareness campaigns, programs and services. FANN educates the public about the importance of healthy eating, cooking, nutrition, and food literacy knowledge. In addition, we provide education about food waste interventions & food safety knowledge.















- Five hundred and sixty (560) website visitors were reached through the FANN website from Jan 1-Aug 8, 2023.
- Website visitors spend 5.2 minutes on average taking an online grocery store lesson through FANN's Smart Shopper Program. The grocery store program helps to improve and strengthen nutrition education knowledge and food literacy skills of moderate and low-income consumers in Texas.
- Website visitors spend 3.2 minutes on average looking at food and nutrition job postings through the FANN Jobs Board which strengthens food and nutrition in Texas by helping to fill important positions in 254 Texas counties across the state that provide needed services to Texans.
- FANN social media posts total 224 posts from 4 social media platforms (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, LinkedIn) Jan 1-Aug 8, 2023. Posts consist of food and nutrition news, information and education that create awareness of food and nutrition programs and services, improve, and strengthen nutrition education knowledge and food literacy skills of moderate and low-income consumers.
- FANN reached 9,551 food, nutrition, and health professionals in 254 Texas counties via email to create awareness about the USDA's **Summer Meals Program** and information on how to participate. The program provides free nutritious meals for kids 18 and under when school is out for the summer.
- Eight hundred and ninety-four (249) food, nutrition, and health professionals from various Texas counties across the state have attended the FANN virtual **Quarterly Speaker Series** in 2023. 88.2% of attendees reported that the information provided by the Quarterly Speaker Series will be helpful to their work in food and nutrition.
- One hundred and fifty-one (151) food, nutrition, and health professionals from various Texas counties across the state attended the FANN virtual Food Access and Nutrition Conference on March 9, 2023. 100% of attendees reported that they learned about food and nutrition information that they didn't know about before. 85.72% of attendees reported that the information provided by the conference will be helpful to their work in food and nutrition.
- Seventy-eight (78) food, nutrition, and health professionals from various Texas counties across the state attended the FANN virtual **Educator Masterclass Series** so far in 2023. 97.5% of attendees reported that the information provided by the Educator Masterclass Series will be helpful to their work in food and nutrition.
