# **PONDERING PASTOR**



#### "Finish Strong!"

"Finish strong!" That's what is often bellowed as words of encouragement for those sprinting toward the finish line in a foot, or automobile race. Really, in any race, those participating are encouraged to finish strong. How else can anyone in the race expect to win other than to give it their all?

That's my hope for our year of ministry here at St. Luke's Lutheran Church. My hope is we finish strong! We have a lot of work to do, however, for that to be the reality.

It has been a challenging year, no understatement. It has been difficult negotiating our congregation's safety with the concerns of the spread of the Delta variant which continues to wreak havoc on our ability to plan our congregational life, together. In fact, as I write this one of our beloved elderly members has been holed up in the ER for over 24 hours after a fall and consequential pelvis fractures because the hospital system is over-extended caring for patients with Covid, WHO HAVE NOT BEEN VACCINATED!

I feel defeated out in the world, as I know many of you do, that we cannot seem to function together with genuine civility to beat back this pandemic as the means we have to do that have been so poisoned by a hyper-partisan atmosphere. I feel defeated at the church, too, as I know many of you do as our capacity to regain a sense of congregational traction feels less like striving ahead, and more like we are stumbling toward some sort of finish line.

Since we reopened months ago to in-person worship we have averaged about 45 worshippers in attendance on Sundays as compared to 135 prior to COVID-19. Our viewership online seems to be tapering off, as well. Before you ask, "Where is everybody," ask yourself, "Where am I? Am I helping to enhance that statistic for the health of my church, which I love, and the rebuilding up of my faith community?" Also concerning is our financial health.

Since January in which we experienced the highest month of pledged-giving in over 3 years at \$44,370.00, we received \$20,597.00 in September, which isn't even enough to meet payroll. Ask yourself, "Am I up to date on my pledge? Am I concerned if I am not?"

We have attempted a return to a semblance of Sunday school which at this writing has only been responded to favorably by our oldest adults. No children or youth.

The God's Work, Our Hands event had a great mixture of older adults along with a smattering of children and youth that made my heart soar because it showed me there are possibilities we can get people together, again. That has not translated though into inertia to get back together to grow in faith and community. I do not intend to be a downer, but I think I have to ask this difficult question?

What will it take to finish this challenging year of ministry strong?

It will take you...me...each one of us coming together! Your participation, your offerings, and your desire to see St. Luke's cross the annual finish line strong is what it will take to ensure we even have the legs to start 2022 strong, as well.

Jesus said at the end of Matthew's gospel when Jesus commissioned the apostles to go and spread the Gospel, "And remember, I am with you always to the end of the age." Finishing the year strong means reminding one another of this spiritual truth. Jesus is with us. The best way for us to remember that is to join one another and get across the finish line in full stride along with Jesus by our presence, our offerings, and our attention to the motto which St. Luke's is built upon, The Church that Encourages Living and Sharing God's Love in all that we do. Let's finish strong!
