### Signing In

In-Processing section at building 1013 CQ desk, to sign in off of leave and initiate in-processing. The CQ will issue you a barracks room if necessary, and ensure you have all paperwork and information to begin in-processing the next duty day. It is important to hand carry a copy of your medical, dental, shot records, birth certificates, marriage licenses, insurance documents, divorce decree, and adoption documents if any. In-processing will last four days.

### Billeting

If you have dependents with you, or are a Staff Sergeant or above, you must arrange for your own lodging. Rooms may be available at the IHG Army Hotels, Building 7301, on Fort Carson (526-4832). If the IHG Army Hotels is not available, you must make arrangements with off-post lodging.

#### **Climate and Altitude**

The Colorado Springs area has a mild year-round climate. In January, the coldest month, temperatures average a high of 43 degrees Fahrenheit and a low of 23 with a mean of 33 degrees. The area averages 37 inches of snow annually.

August, the warmest month, has an average high of 84 degrees and a low of 61 degrees with a mean of 73 degrees.

Fort Carson's elevation is above 6,000 feet, and some newcomers may experience slight fatigue at first. Because of the elevation, new personnel are allowed 30 days to adjust to the altitude and to reach Army fitness standards.

#### **Colorado Road Conditions**

Colorado weather can be erratic. During the colder months, days can vary from snow to sun to rain or ice. And if you are traveling through a mountain pass, take the time to check the weather conditions to ensure roads are not closed due to frequent snow and ice or mudslides — even in the summer months. Storms may suddenly occur, and preparation is key to staying safe.

If you are traveling in the winter, come prepared. It is advisable to have equipment such as tire chains, blankets, flashlights and bottled water for emergency situations. The Colorado State Highway Patrol road conditions are updated around the clock; call 303-639-1111.

#### **Weapons Registration**

Military personnel assigned or attached to Fort Carson, civilian employees, visitors or anyone wishing to bring a firearm onto the installation must register their weapon with the Provost Marshal Office (PMO) Military Police Desk, building 2700, within five working days after acquisition of the firearm or initial arrival to Fort Carson. For details, call 526-6199.

Privately owned firearms may only be transported on Fort Carson if the individual is transporting the weapon to or from a place of authorized storage, sale, hunting area, hunter safety class, firing range, or gun/repair shop. During transport, the firearm and the ammunition must remain separated within the vehicle.

Post regulations make it illegal to possess, store, maintain or display a blackjack, gravity or inertia knife, switchblade, stun gun, zip gun or any other instrument designed to injure or cause death. Weapons will not be stored in vehicles under any circumstances.
