Here's the latest from the contractor, Crown Castle-- all five towers have been erected. Four of the sites have been tested an are on-air. The tower at Jetton and Harbor Light is not in operation yet.

As for cell service, only Verizon is active at this time.

From Crown Castle-- "The poles were built and approved to accommodate multiple carriers, so when other carriers are ready to install in this area, Crown Castle will be able to easily add their equipment with minimal disruption."

BAILEY ROAD AND HWY 115 CONSTRUCTION

Improving Traffic Flow in our Town



Heads Up: Construction on the intersection of Bailey Road and NC Highway 115 begins **Monday**, **January 18**.

The project's goal is to increase the intersection capacity by adding or extending turn lanes on all sides.

There should be no impact on traffic flow for the first 3-4 weeks of the project.

In February, residents can expect lane closures during non-peak hours (9 am - 4 pm), potentially impacting school drop-off and pickup. One lane of traffic will remain open in each direction at all times.

Traffic will be shifted to the center turn lane, which will accommodate left turns, right turns, and straight movements.

The Town and its contractor, NJR, have been working diligently to ensure as little interruption as possible. Construction is estimated to be complete by August 2021, before the start of the new school year.



Celebrating The Peninsula's 30 Year Anniversary!


March 1991-2021







- Attach a written description of the scope of the proposed changes
- Attach a <u>property survey</u> with the location of the proposed changes clearly marked



Also, if asking for a pool or playset, please mark location as this homeowner did using stakes. This is a big help when the ACC members visit your property.



Once received, we do our best to respond quickly. Keep in mind there has been a record number of requests just since January. Neighbors are asking for pools, playsets, driveways, new exterior colors, tree removal, and many more upgrades to their properties.



Rule of thumb--

If it's a change outside your home, you need to request architectural approval

It's that time of year!



Many of us are outside working in our yards. Once you clip, trim, mow, rake and blow--what do you do with the yard waste? Here's a reminder from the Town of Cornelius.



Yard Waste Collections

- Clear plastic bags can be tied and any other style bag that is not clear must be left open. Bags over 50 pounds will be left on the curbside.
- Loose piles consisting of grass (of any kind) or organic matter will not be serviced.
- Waste Pro will collect bagged leaves up to a maximum of 20 bags per week.
- Manageable piles of limbs or brush will be collected. This doesn't include Pampas Grass type material; this material must be bagged for retrieval. Tree limbs will be collected only if they meet the following specifications:
 - No larger than 5 inches in diameter.
 - No longer than 5 feet in length.
 - Stacked in piles that do not exceed 4 feet high x 5 feet long x 4 feet wide.
 - There should also be 2 feet in between each pile.
- Do not place yard debris on the sidewalk.
- Yard waste should only be placed on the curb of the house that generated the yard waste.



Waste Pro trucks will collect your recycling bins on Monday, May 24th as normal.



Cornelius and Waste Pro did not mail the informational calendars in time to begin collections on June 1st as we were told and had published.


Instead, property owners should receive those calendars in your mailbox tomorrow or Friday outlining the new plan.

"For those residents who have their recycle carts out now, please bring them in. They will not get collected this week. They can put the carts out on the 7^{th} and 14^{th} . Then, the next collection date for the Peninsula will be June 28^{th} ."





Dock Work



Most property owners are aware Duke Energy must approve changes or additions to the docks serving any Lot in the Peninsula community, but <u>please remember</u> the property owners association (PPOA) also has to approve the changes before they are implemented.

Property Change Request Form



Section 2.8.1 of the Peninsula Landscape and Architectural Guidelines reads:

The design, color, location, dimensions and materials of docks, piers, boat slips, mooring posts, seawalls, boat houses and any other structure or improvement constructed adjacent to or appurtenant to a Waterfront Lot or otherwise within the boundary of Lake Norman must be approved in advance in writing by the ACC. It is the Owner's responsibility to obtain any permits or approvals required from Duke Power Company.

"NO SWIMMING" ADVISORY!

Paradise Cove Court area in Peninsula



Larger Map

Mecklenburg County issued the "No Swimming" advisory after an estimated 405 gallons of untreated sewage was discharged from a residence on Paradise Cove Court in Cornelius to a cove on Lake Norman. The discharge originated from a pipe damaged by a private contractor. The pipe has been repaired and the discharge discontinued.

Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services staff will monitor water quality in the area until conditions are deemed safe for human contact at which time the no swimming advisory will be lifted.

Rusty Rozzelle, Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services' Water Quality Program Manager, said the advisories are standard procedure. "Since this cove on Lake Norman is used for recreation, it is important to inform residents of the discharge and advise against swimming in the impacted area due to the potential risk to human health," said Rozzelle.

If you prefer to do it yourself-- use gloss black and the Verde-Green, both paints from Sherwin-Williams. In order to accomplish the "verde" finish, contractors first apply a coat of gloss black oil based enamel paint.

The finished top coat is a satin acrylic paint color mixed to match the original "verde" green and applied in an artistic manner in order to achieve the "verde" appearance.

There is a job file saved which any person can access at the Cornelius Sherwin-Williams branch under "Peninsula Mailboxes" with the coloring to match the "verde" green.

Swimming pool?



The PPOA has been swamped this summer with requests to build backyard pools.



We visit the backlogged properties as soon as possible, but often, we need more information from the property owner. Here's a checklist of how to provide a successful architectural request--



- First, and foremost, have the pool, pool equipment, decking and landscaping all drawn to scale on a recent official survey.
- Provide color photos or brochures of the proposed pool, showing both colors and materials to be used
- 3. Color photos showing the decking, cabana and any other proposed additions
- 4. Details as to how the pool equipment would be screened from view of the street and neighboring homes





Grinder Pumps



Many of the homes in the Peninsula community have a private sewer lift station maintained by the Peninsula Property Owners Association through the contractor McCall Brothers. Owners with private sewer lift stations on their lots are asked to be sensitive and vigilant to what items are put down the drains and toilets of the home.

Never put any of the following materials into sinks, toilets or drains:

Glass, metal, wood, seafood shells
Papers, socks, rags or cloth of any kind
Plastic, rubber or latex objects (toys, eating
utensils, condoms, etc.)
Any strong chemical, toxic, caustic, or poisonous
substance
Degreasing solvents

Any explosive or flammable material
Lubricating oil or grease
Cooking fat (lard, oil, grease)
Hair clippings or dental floss
Clean up wipes or any non-biodegradable material
(including feminine hygiene products)
Kitty litter or aquarium gravel

When something goes down the drain and ends up under one of these not-so-attractive green covers, it causes a problem at the station resulting in a service call expense. The owner is required to reimburse the association for the cost.

In addition to the service call expense, these items cause unusual wear and tear on the station reducing the overall life expectancy of its major parts and components.




A Nominating Committee has been appointed to receive nominations, learn more about the potential candidates and ultimately present them to the membership for election early next year.

Earlier this week, without any advance notice or warning to the property owners association, crews from AG Drilling started work to replace underground lines in the right-of-way on both sides of Peninsula Shores DR, Sunset Cove LN, Scotscraig LN, Dunblane CT and a small section of Jetton RD in the same area.

Crews left the attached door hanger at the homes impacted providing point of contact:

<u>Chad Creech with Primoris T&D 828-578-1789 for</u> any questions or concerns.

Chad says crews are replacing the "power main" between transformers on both sides of the roads on behalf of Duke Energy who subcontracted Primoris T&D who ultimately contracted with AG Drilling to complete the work in the public right of way. Their work is limited to these streets only and they hope to have the work complete before the holidays.

Utility crews are also working further back in the community on Springwinds DR to complete an emergency repair to the underground power line connecting directly to one of the homes. This project appears to be isolated and not related.

The property owners association (PPOA) will continue to pass on what information we are able to learn about utility work in the community. In most cases, there has been no advance notice or contact about this work occurring in the public right of way.


