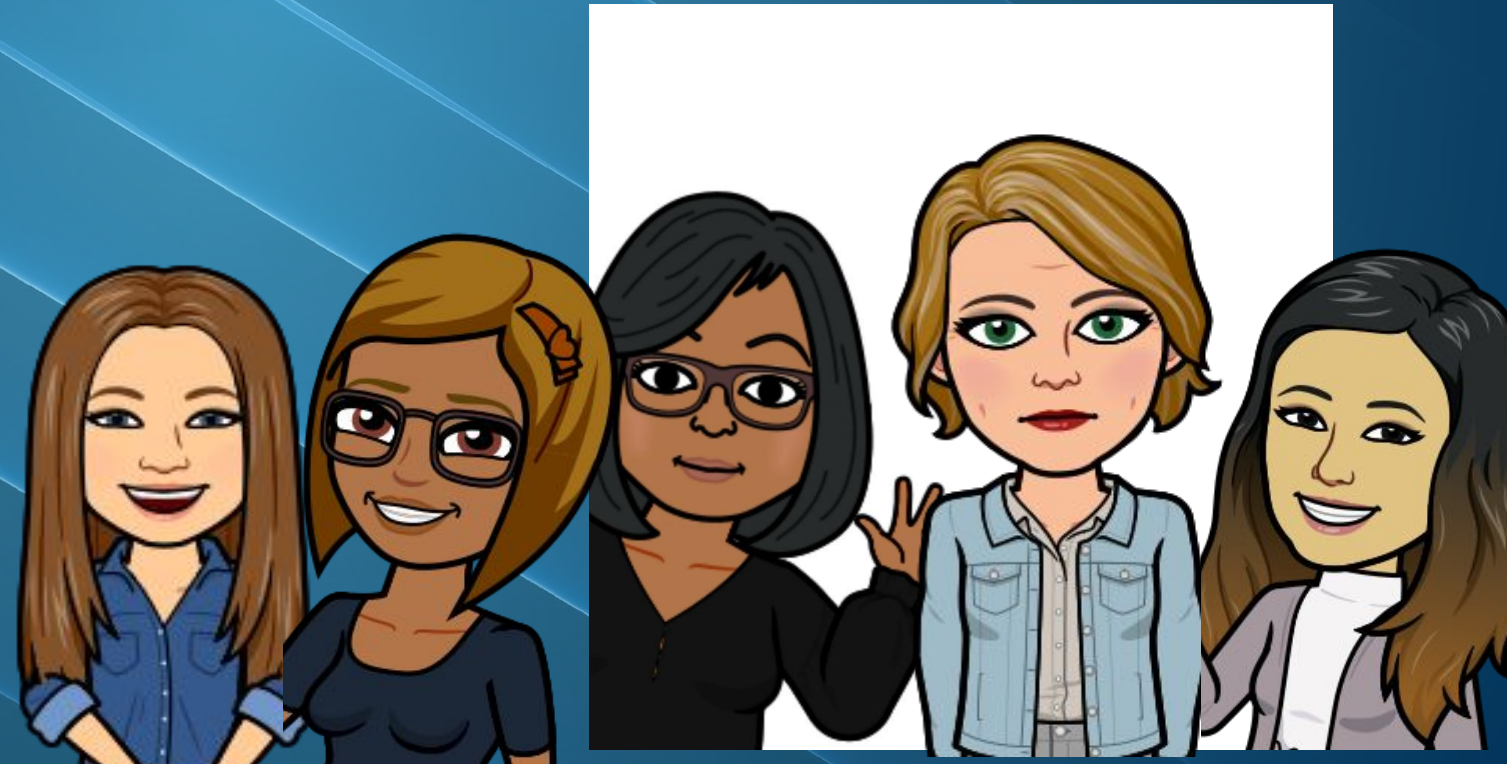

# Mrs. Holly Blattler Eidinger MSW, LSW, HSV Social Worker



- Provide case management services including referrals to community resources & collaboration with other professionals who provide services to students.
- Assist students and families by providing crisis management services (especially when the student does not have a back up treatment team) and connecting students to community resources for further assessment.
- Conference with students and families to discuss issues related to truancy and develop Student Attendance Improvement Plans. Communicate with parents regarding absences to school.
- Assist students and families dealing with homelessness, hunger, violence, neglect/abuse to access resources like shelters, food and medical care.

## Overview of Student Assistance Program (SAP)

- Systematic team process used to mobilize school resources to remove barriers to learning.
  - SAP is designed to assist in identifying issues including:
    - alcohol
    - tobacco
    - other drugs
    - mental health issues
- Professionally trained team, including school staff (administrators, regular and special education teachers, SS team, psychologist) and liaisons from community drug/alcohol and mental health agencies.
- SAP team members are trained to identify issues, determine whether or not the presenting issue lies within the responsibility of the school, and to make recommendations to assist the student and the parent. When the issue lies beyond the scope of the school, the SAP team will assist the parent and student so they may access services within the community. SAP team members do not diagnose, treat or refer to treatment; but they may refer a student to a liaison who may screen or assess for further community based services and support.

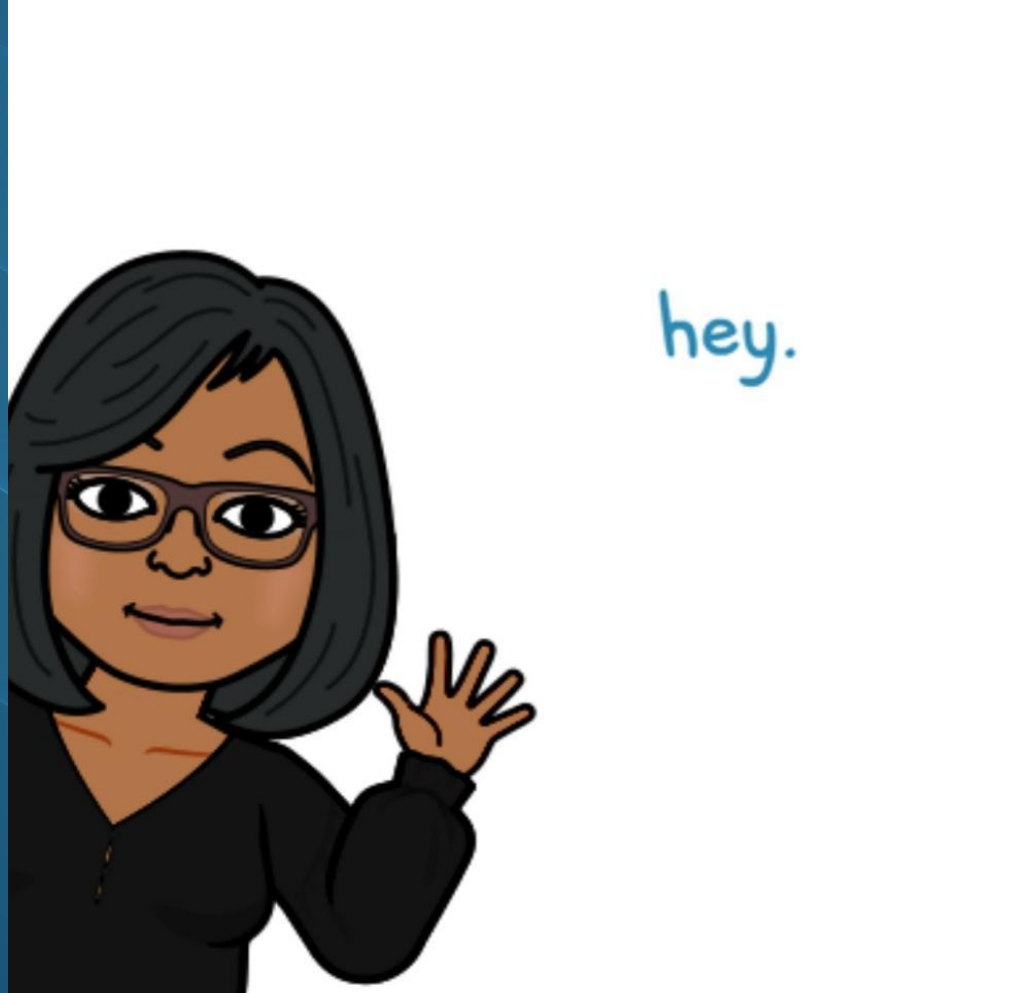

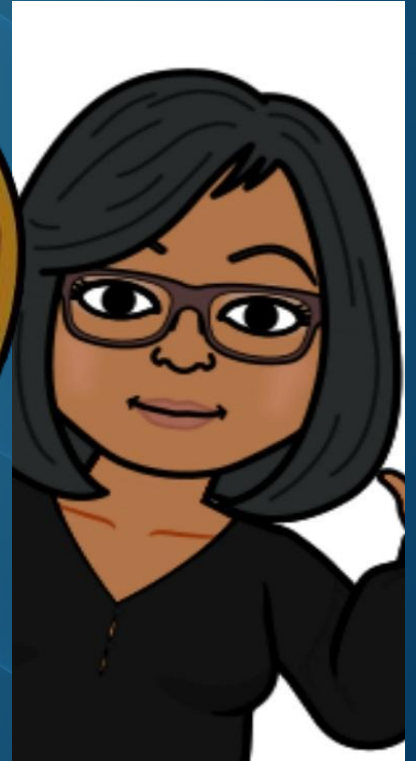
