



COURSE DEVELOPMENT & TRAINING

- Massachusetts Interpreter Training: NAETISL was awarded a contract from the MA Department of Elementary and Secondary Education to develop interpreter training applicable to school-based and freelance interpreters.
- Pilot Program: We successfully piloted intermediate and advanced interpreter courses with over 40 learners in Massachusetts.
- · Language Ambassador Training Launched: NAETISL collaborated with the MA Department of Elementary and Secondary Education to create a foundational training to support high-quality interactions between school-based staff and families who speak a language other than English: https://www.doe.mass.edu/rlo/language-access/training/index.html#/

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

- Glossary Development Task Force: Our team has invested over 100 hours to update and edit our soonto-be-published glossary of frequently used terms in education (English/Spanish).
- Tips and Suggestions: We created videos for NAETISL members with tips to interpret during special education, disciplinary hearings and more.
- Pre-Session: Our collaborators and partners helped us translate a <u>pre-session</u> for interpreters to 13 languages.
- Empowerment Resources: We collaborated with RevEd and our Multilingual Advisory Board to expand our family empowerment resources including translating a fact sheet about child interpreters into 14 languages.





PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Introduction to Educational Interpreting: We launched a 2-hr session with an overview of foundational skills for spoken language interpreters with over 60 participants trained.
- Advanced Course Interpreting Spoken Languages in Education Settings: We trained three new cohorts of school-based and freelance interpreters in education and obtained course accreditation from the Certification Commission for Healthcare Interpreters (CCHI).
- Continuing Education: We offered 12 monthly learning sessions for translators and spoken language interpreters in education based on NAETISL member feedback.
- Annual Conference: NAETISL successfully organized its third virtual conference with 100+ attendees and 23 national and international guest speakers.

OUTREACH

- Collaboration: We presented sessions on interpreter-family-educator collaboration in nine professional conferences nationwide.
- U.S. Department of Education: NAETISL gathered feedback from 65 members for a collective response to a request for information from the U.S. Department of Education, Office of English Language Acquisition about interpretation and translation in education.
- Free Sessions: We conducted three free virtual sessions for educators and school leaders on engaging language diverse families and the impact of trained spoken language interpreters.
- Missouri Developmental Disabilities Council: We conducted free webinars on language access for 150+ school leaders and educators and partnered with RevED to conduct training on language access for parents of children with disabilities: https://naetisl.org/missouri-language-access-project





NATIONAL CERTIFICATION PILOT TEST

- Job Task Analysis: NAETISL completed a spoken language interpreter Job Task Analysis as the first step to developing a legally-defensible and valid national certification test.
- Subject Matter Experts: We collaborated with 24 Subject Matter Experts to develop written questions and oral scripts for our future national certification pilot test for interpreters in education.
- Exam Development: We worked with psychometricians to train Subject Matter Experts on writing effective examination questions and evaluating items to ensure they are fair, clear, and conform to item-writing best practices.
- Exam Platform: We selected a web-based exam delivery platform to accommodate a written test and oral components to assess sight translation, consecutive and simultaneous interpreting in education.

MEMBERSHIP AND TEAM GROWTH

- Our New Coordinators: We welcomed four contracted team members to support our communication, professional development, membership and stakeholder engagement initiatives.
- Our Members: The NAETISL family now counts with NAETISL Ambassadors in 31 states and seven countries (Japan, Guatemala, Mexico, Canada, Venezuela, Argentina and the Dominican Republic).

- Scholarships: We provided 22 professional development scholarships to NAETISL members to attend our annual conference, continuing education opportunities and courses for spoken language interpreters in education. · Language Access Champions: NAETISL recognized six agents of change during our annual
